DA: P29/kg rice at Kadiwa sites to benefit 30% target population

MANILA – The Department of Agriculture (DA) on Tuesday said the 30% target population, including those with weaker purchasing power, will benefit from the sale of PHP29 per kilogram of rice in various Kadiwa sites.

"Ang intensyon noon is para sa targeted beneficiary na mostly iyong mga mahihirap, tsaka seniors, atsaka iyong mga solo parents (Its intention is for the targeted beneficiaries who are mostly the poor, elderly, and single parents). That's about 30 percent of the total population," said DA Assistant Secretary Arnel de Mesa in an ambush interview. He said persons with

disabilities (PWDs) and beneficiaries of the Pantawid Pamilyang Pilipino Program (4Ps) are also included in the subsidized rice sale.

MANILA – The Department of Agriculture (DA) on Tuesday said climate-smart mapping of rive areas will help alleviate the destructive effects of the looming La Niña.

MANILA – The Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD) on Tuesday vowed to continue implementing the Empowerment and Reaffirmation of Paternal Abilities (ER-PAT), an agency project that gives importance and emphasis on the fathers' parental roles, responsibilities and abilities.

"ERPAT sees the significant role of fathers in performing multiple roles in all aspects of child rearing and development including the care and behavior management of adolescent children,"

DSWD Assistant Secretary for Disaster Response Management Group Irene Dumlao said in a news release Tuesday.

To strengthen the program, the DSWD conducts capability building and training of implementers, ER-PAT members, and local government units (LGUs), Dumlao said.

Last May, the DSWD Field Office-7 (Western Visayas) launched the 1st ERPAT Regional Summit as part of the celebration of the International Day of Families (IDF) 2024.

For palay, Manalo expressed optimism in attaining the 20.44 million MT target production for the year despite the looming La Niña.

"Tumataas iyong (There is increasing) productivity per hectare," he said, noting areas hitting or surpassing five MT in production per hectare.

Other drivers of high palay production include minimal losses during the El Niño phenomenon, and wider areas planted to hybrid rice varieties nationwide.

MANILA-For April, er network in Quezon Manila Water achieved a 100-percent score in its wastewater effluent compliance quality scorecard, versus the target of 95 percent.

The score was based on the scorecard set by the Metropolitan Waterworks and Sewerage System (MWSS) Regulatory Office relative to the applicable General Effluent Standards set in the issued Wastewater Discharge Permits to the treatment facilities by ei-Environmental ther Management Bureau of the Department of Environment and Natural Resources (EMB-DENR) or the Laguna Development Lake Authority (LLDA).

Under DENR's Updated General Effluent Standards, wastewater treatment plants should produce "Class C" effluent with eliminated bio-nutrients such as ammonia and phosphorus, which is deemed to be safe for water recycling for non-contact purposes such as toilet-flushing, cleaning and irrigation, and ultimately, should be safe for discharge to water bodies and the marine life.

As part of its sustainability agenda and regulatory compliance, Manila Water is ramping up the development of new infrastructure and upgrading of its wastewater facilities.

The company has invested PHP271 million for construction of the 1.95-kilometer (km) Kalayaan Sewer Replacement Package 2 and the 3.23-km Kalayaan Sewer Replacement Package 3 which will improve the sew-

These include, but not limited to, families with cases of mild and severe abuses; family members with poor health or nutrition; presence of outof-school youth; inappropriate behavior models of family heads or members such as use and abuse of substance; and solo male parents.

"We in the DSWD want our programs and services to be inclusive so that no sector will be left behind. We will continue to enhance our programs and services for the improvement of life of Filipino families," Dumlao said. (PNA)

PH delegation gets top Japan lawmakers' vow to hire more Filipinos

MANILA – House of Representatives Speaker Ferdinand Martin G. Romualdez said the Philippine delegation he led has secured a firm commitment from top Japanese parliamentarians to facilitate the hiring of more Filipinos by the Japanese government, particularly in crucial sectors, such as elderly care.

They acquired the commitment during high-level discussions with National Diet of Japan Speaker Fukushiro Nukaga and Vice Speaker Banri Kaieda at the Tokyo parliamentary building on Tuesday.

During the meeting, Kaieda acknowledged Japan's demographic challenges and the valuable contributions of Filipino workers.

"Japan is facing a decrease in population, and in this regard, Japan truly appreciates the Filipinos working here, especially elderly care workers. We are looking forward to welcoming more Filipinos to work in Japan," Kaieda said.

Responding to this commitment, Romualdez underscored the potential for enhanced cooperation between the two nations.

He said the Philippines has a growing population, and Filipinos are more than happy to come and work in Japan after receiving the appropriate training.

"This will enable Filipino workers to integrate into society and benefit from the best practices and advanced technology that Japan has to offer," Romualdez said.

"It creates an ideal environment for Japan to continue investing in the Philippines, not just in human resources but in Japanese-trained human resources, which will further promote economic cooperation between our countries."

Uplift the economy

In the same meeting, Nukaga committed to continued cooperation to help uplift the Philippine economy, noting the presence of 1,400 Japanese companies operating in the Philippines.

"I will continue to cooperate with the Philippines to help uplift the Philippine economy," he said.

Romualdez thanked Japan for its unwavering support for more than 300,000 Filipinos residing in the country.

"We appreciate your efforts in securing, nurturing, and accepting our Filipinos who are in Japan," he said, citing the importance of these diplomatic efforts in fostering a strong community and ensuring the welfare of Filipino expatriates.

Romualdez also highlighted Japan's leading role in providing economic assistance through the Official Development Fund (ODA), which is important in the Philippines' development and disaster response.

He also mentioned and acknowledged the continuous support from the Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA), noting its contributions to the Philippines' economic landscape.

MANILA – A House leader on Tuesday filed a resolution seeking a congressional inquiry into the issuance of special resident visas and the delayed registration of births as possible avenues enabling the influx of Chinese nationals in the Philippines.

In filing House Resolution 1771, Deputy Majority Leader and ACT-CIS Party-list Rep. Erwin Tulfo said the processes for granting the Special Resident Retiree's Visa (SRRV) and Special Investor's Resident Visa (SIRV), in addition to the late registration of births, should be assessed as these could serve as channels for foreign nationals to enter the Philippines, stay indefinitely, and even maintain employment.

He said around 30,000 Chinese nationals were allowed to permanently reside in the country despite not meeting the age requirement for the retiree visas.

To date, the DA is conducting a trial sale of PHP29/kg. of rice in select Kadiwa sites, prioritizing 4Ps beneficiaries, solo parents, PWDs, and senior citizens, with the allowed volume set at 3 kg per buyer.

The subsidized pric-

ing scheme may be rolled out in August through the National Irrigation Administration (NIA)'s contract farming program with farmers' cooperatives.

Earlier, the NIA said around 100,000 metric tons of rice equivalent to 10 million sacks of 10 kg. rice can be produced, with 4 million sacks targeted to be distributed in August.

De Mesa said others who are not included in the select beneficiaries may still enjoy the expected lower rice retail prices following the tariff reduction from 35 to 15 percent. limited to labor market dynamics, national security, and public order.

Several crimes were linked to the Chinese influx, including human trafficking, scamming, kidnapping, illegal detention, prostitution, and other fraudulent practices, he added.

"Recent raids of POGO (Philippine Offshore Gaming Operators) establishments also resulted in traces of criminal activity and the discovery of offices, dorms, villas, and lifestyle facilities within such hubs, indicating prolonged presence and actual living situations within supposed business establishments," he said.

Tulfo also highlighted the case of suspended Bamban, Tarlac Mayor Alice Guo, pointing out the potential risks for abuse in the process of delayed registration of births.

He said these could have long-term con-

Eliminating rebagging

The National Food Authority (NFA), meanwhile, said it is finalizing a plan to eliminate rebagging to save more funds.

NFA administrator Larry Lacson said this strategy makes NFA act like a trader since its end product is milled rice and not palay.

He also mentioned a significant estimated amount of savings with the waiving of 10 million NFA sacks sequences, including ultimately allowing non-nationals to participate in various social, economic, and political activities, such as running for or holding public office, reserved only for Filipino citizens.

Guo, whose identity and citizenship have been placed under scrutiny, was placed under a six-month preventive suspension without pay by the Office of the Ombudsman on May 31 following the administrative complaints of the Department of the Interior and Local Government for grave misconduct, serious dishonesty, gross neglect of duty and conduct prejudicial to the best interest of the service.

Authorities have raided POGO firms in Tarlac and Pampanga in the past four months over alleged "scamming activities" and other serious concerns, including national security. (PNA)

He said the high-level exchanges and visits by respective heads of state, including the historic signing of the trilateral agreement in Washington DC involving Japan, the Philippines, and the United States, further underscored the strengthening alliance.

"We are happy because this is a great lead-up to the celebration of 70 years of our diplomatic relations in 2026," he said.

Robust ties

Nukaga pointed out the enduring and robust relationship between Japan and the Philippines.

"Japan and the Philippines, both island nations, have a strong foundation to build good relations and friendly bridges," he added, as he acknowledged the significant presence of Filipinos in Japan, particularly in his hometown of Ibaraki Prefecture.

Reflecting on his previous roles, Nukaga mentioned his tenure as the chair of the parliamentary group for JICA and as the Minister of Finance, where he led efforts to increase JICA's budget.

He noted that the Philippines is the third-largest recipient of Japan's ODA, after India and Bangladesh.

Discussing the trilateral meetings among Japan, the Philippines, and the United States, Nukaga stressed the importance of these alliances.

"The alliance between Japan and the United States is strong and built on trust. It is very important to promote cooperation among our three countries to ensure safe maritime transport and the safety and stability of the region," he said.

Nukaga also noted the recent joint maritime exercise involving Japan, the US, the Philippines, and Canada as a testament to this cooperation.

He emphasized the foundational principles of security, democracy, and the rule of law.

Also present during the meeting were Japan House of Representatives International Affairs Department Director General Yamamoto Hironori, House Majority Leader Manuel Jose M. Dalipe, senior Deputy Speaker Aurelio Gonzales Jr., Deputy Speaker David Suarez,
