DILG tells BFP to clear roads in Taal Volcano-affected provinces

QUEZON CITY, - Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG) Secretary Eduardo M. Año has directed the Bureau of Fire Protection (BFP) to "mobilize all resources in aid of the road-clearing and cleaning operations

as well as other needed efforts" in the aftermath of the Taal Volcano eruption. "In these trying times, we must unite as a nation and respond with urgency. I therefore direct the BFP to deploy all its firetrucks and assets and perform all needed actions to assist in the

road clearing and cleaning of ashfall and volcanic debris in all affected provinces," Año said.

President Duterte provides assistance to residents affected by Taal Volcano eruption

BATANGAS CITY, -- President Rodrigo Roa Duterte extended financial assistance Tuesday to farmers and fisherfolk affected by the eruption of Taal Volcano in Batangas.

During the event held at the Batangas Provincial Sports Complex, President Duterte handed over P7.5-million livelihood

assistance to Batangas farmers whose crops were damaged by the volcano's eruption and another P3.5-million assistance was released to the fisherfolk in the province.

He also turned over a check through a Batangas rural bank to aid farmers in their recovery from the disaster. All the

assistance extended by the President came from the Department of Agriculture's budget.

Aside from handing over cash assistance, the President also led the ceremonial distribution of family food packs to five families affected by the Taal Volcano eruption.

All systems go in Cavite for Taal volcanic eruption response operations

Cavite Governor Jonvic Remulla convened an emergency meeting of the Provincial Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council together with the mayors of the different cities and municipalities on January 16, 2010 at The Bayleaf Hotel in the City of Gen. Trias to discuss the impacts of Taal volcanic eruption and the current situation in the different LGUs with evacuees from the heavily affected municipalities of

Batangas.

Alert Level 4 is still in effect based on PHIVOLCS Taal Volcano Bulletin and hazardous eruption is imminent. As of the latest situation report from the Provincial Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Office, at 8:00 AM of January 17, there are currently 19 LGUs in Cavite providing temporary shelter to some 6,472 families totaling to 28,461 individuals and



still counting with the continuous waves of evacuees coming in.

Some issues have been identified in the different LGUs which are

also affected by the volcanic eruption particularly in Tagaytay City, the municipalities of Alfonso, Amadeo, Silang and Indang including the

disruption of water and power supply. Mayor Frederick Vida of Mendez reported that MERALCO has been conducting continuous cleaning operations for the restoration of power supply.

Health and sanitation concerns were also raised by Dr. Nelson Soriano, Chief Epidemiologist of the Provincial Office. Some of the observed health conditions of evacuees were hypertension, common colds, the status of

pregnant and lactating mothers, among others. The PHO conducts medical missions, measles and polio vaccination, and other health initiatives as well as misting in partnership with the Provincial Government - Environment and Natural Resources Office. They also recommend the provision of Portalets, generator sets, potable drinking water and breastfeeding areas at the evacuation sites.

kalsada at mga sasakyang natambakan ng abo ng bulkan," he added.

Alert Status 4 which entails imminent hazardous eruption was raised after Taal Volcano's intensified volcanic eruption sent spews of ash columns several kilometers into the atmosphere. Urgent evacuation of citizens proved to be a difficult task as wet ash fall covered major roads and residential areas.

Año explained that as the Taal Volcano continues to spew ash and other volcanic debris, it is imperative that consistent aid in clearing the road and evacuating the people are implemented.

"The BFP has the firetrucks and water provisions to help in clearing the roads of ash fall from the volcano. Itong putik na ito ay nagiging malaking hadlang sa paglikas ng ating mga kababayan at sa paghahatid ng relief goods sa kanila," he said.

According to Año, 531 fire personnel, 147 firetrucks, 39 Emergency Medical Service personnel, and 9 ambulances from BFP-CALABARZON have been deployed to the affected areas and are at the ready to assist in road flushing activities.

He also commended firefighters and police officers of the Philippine National Police (PNP) who went out of their way and assisted evacuees at great risk to their lives.

"Salamat sa inyong kusang-loob na pagtulong sa ating mga kababayan. But we

cannot stop now. Malaki ang naging pinsala ng pagputok ng bulkan at maaari pang lumaki ito sa mga darating na araw. Hold your ground, kailangan kayo ng ating mga kababayan," he said.

Regional Efforts

The DILG Chief said that the Department is currently monitoring the presence of all mayors and governors in affected areas and are receiving reports from all DILG field offices.

"We will continue to monitor all LGUs and ensure that their needs are brought to the attention of the government gayundin ang pagtitiyak na ang mga mayor ay kumikilos para sa kanilang mga constituents," he said.

According to Año, the DILG issued a memorandum to DILG-CALABARZON on the conduct of Mandatory Evacuation for Barangays Susceptible to Taal Volcano Ballistic Projectile, Base Surge, and Volcanic Tsunami. A memorandum on the coordination mechanism for LGUs who signified to provide humanitarian assistance to Taal Volcano Eruption affected areas was also issued.

"We have also activated the NCR, CALABARZON, and Central Luzon's Management of the Dead and Missing Persons Clusters, and reiterated to preposition and prepare for the eventuality of immediate deployment," Año said.

Año also said that an order was also issued through the DILG-CODIX regarding the Humanitarian Assistance for Taal Volcano Eruption

Office (PCSO), the Department of Health (DOH) and the Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD) were the lead agencies that provided the assistance.

After Taal Volcano's eruption on Sunday, major government agencies such as the National Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council (NDRRM), Department of Public Works and Highways (DPWH) and DSWD rushed to affected areas to provide support, the President said.

The Chief Executive assured that the government has the resources to help those in need until they get back on their feet.

"Itong mga kalamidad ay nangyayari po sa buong bayan at kailangan po na may gagawin tayo na tinatawag na maibabamo man lang naman ang kahirapan at ang danger 'pag pumutok itong mga 'to,'" he told affected Batangas residents in his

- Affected Areas and Mandatory Evacuation in all high-risk barangays around the Taal Volcano.

Meanwhile, LGUs in NCR were advised to coordinate with all barangays regarding the influx of evacuees from affected LGUs for security monitoring purposes; and the monitoring of respiratory-related illnesses triggered by ash

speech.

"Nandito ako para tumulong sa mga tao na tinamaan nitong eruption. And gagawin ko lahat— itong Batangas, Cavite, Laguna, at ibang lugar pa na matulungan namin para bumalik sa normal."

Communities affected by crisis like typhoon and earthquake must immediately get back to normalcy, according to President Duterte. "Huwag mo nang patagalin. Basta 'pag dumating 'yan at na-implement na natin ang lahat, go back to normal life immediately. 'Yan ang dapat gawin ninyo."

Prior to extending assistance to affected residents, the President attended a situation briefing on the disaster with different government agencies.

The President expressed satisfaction over the response of concerned agencies and local government units (LGUs) noting their timely intervention ensured public safety and prevented loss of lives. (PND)

DILG will also coordinate with Metro Manila LGUs for vehicles, breathing apparatus, and water purifiers that they can commit for possible deployment to affected LGUs in CALABARZON for evacuation assistance purposes. (DILG)

The PNP also provided logistical and manpower support at the onset of the eruption deploying personnel in affected areas in Batangas for rescue and evacuation and at strategic locations in Cavite for disaster response operations.

DTI reported no cases of price increase in prime commodities but noted a shortage in the supply of face masks in some areas. They are continuously monitoring the prices as well as the implication of the disaster in business establishments in the affected LGUs.

Professor Genaro Cuaresma, Director for Institution Building of the UP Resilience Institute who was invited in the meeting shared what the

University of the Philippines system can share to the province in terms of scientific and technical assistance, psychosocial intervention for the affected individuals, agriculture and livestock concerns, infrastructure assessment as well as call for donation.

Governor Remulla lauded the efforts of the different LGUs in providing for the victims of the calamity from the province of Batangas and takes pride in the different acts of compassion showed by Caviteños in the face of the calamity. The Governor likewise leaves the announcement of class suspension or resumption to the local chief executives based on their assessment of the situation in their locality.

DOH confirms 4 new polio cases in PH

MANILA -- The Department of Health (DOH) on Thursday confirmed four more polio cases nationwide following the declaration of an outbreak in September 2019.

In a statement, the DOH said the total number of polio cases in the country is now 16.

The Research Institute of Tropical Medicine (RITM) reported two additional polio cases from Maguindanao, both males, aged two- and three-years old; one polio case from Sultan Kudarat, a two-year old male; and one polio case from Quezon City, a three-year old male.

They manifested fever, diarrhea, muscle pain, asymmetric ascending paralysis and weakness of extremities.

To ensure that no child is left unvaccinated and to boost protection for those already vaccinated, the DOH extended its Sabayang Patak Kontra Polio (SPKP) with the succeeding rounds scheduled from January 20 to February 2 in all regions of Mindanao, and from January 27 to February 7 in the

National Capital Region.

"I urge all parents and caregivers of children under five years old to take part in the coming SPKP campaign rounds scheduled in your respective areas. Have your children, including those with private physicians or pediatricians, vaccinated with oral polio vaccine by health workers and b a k u n a t o r s (vaccinators)," Health Secretary Francisco Duque III said.

"There is no overdose with the oral polio vaccine as additional polio doses can provide additional protection to children," he said.

In line with its aim to accomplish 95 percent coverage in all identified areas for every SPKP round, the DOH, together with the local government units, urged all health facilities to strengthen their Acute Flaccid Paralysis (AFP) surveillance and to promptly report every case of AFP in any child under 15 years of age and gather sufficient stool specimen samples.

"The outbreak must be put to a halt, and we can only do this if all our

Avoid wearing contact lenses, use eyeglasses first if possible," it added.

In case of eye irritation, the DOH reminded the public to refrain from rubbing their eyes and to wash them with clean water.

Persistent eye and

respiratory problems must be consulted with appropriate health specialists, the DOH said.

To keep volcanic ashes from entering residential and business establishments, the DOH said windows and doors

must be closed at all times.

Hanging moist curtains by the windows and doors would keep volcanic ashes from penetrating indoors, the DOH added.

Duterte creates task force on 'zero hunger'

MANILA -- To free more Filipinos from hunger and achieve food security, President Rodrigo Duterte has created an inter-agency task force on zero hunger.

Duterte signed Executive Order 101 on January 10 creating an inter-agency task force on zero hunger which will be chaired by Cabinet Secretary Karlo Nograles.

Serving as his vice-chairperson is Social Welfare Secretary Joselito Bautista.

Members of the task force include the Agriculture Secretary, Agrarian Reform Secretary, Budget Secretary, Education Secretary, Environment Secretary, Health Secretary, Labor Secretary, Interior Secretary, Trade Secretary, Science Secretary, Communications Secretary, National Economic and Development Authority Director-General, and the Commission on Higher Education Chairperson.

In the EO, Duterte recognized that involuntary hunger, food security, undernutrition,

and child wasting, stunting and mortality, continue to be serious concerns in the country.

"There is a need to carefully coordinate, rationalize, monitor and assess the efforts of concerned government agencies and instrumentalities to ensure a whole-of-government approach to eradicating hunger and achieving food security," Duterte said.

The task force will be assigned to formulate a National Food Policy (NFP), which will outline national priorities based on a comprehensive understanding of the problem of hunger and related issues, and will provide a roadmap for achieving zero hunger, taking into consideration existing laws and issuances, as well as international law and treaty obligations.

Under the NFP, initiatives for ending hunger, achieving food security, improving nutrition, and promoting sustainable agriculture will be identified.

It will coordinate and rationalize the efforts of concerned government agencies and

instrumentalities to ensure a "whole-of-government" approach to attaining zero hunger and at the same time evaluate, through the identification of key performance indicators, the government's progress in ending hunger, achieving food security, improving nutrition, and promoting sustainable agriculture.

Technical working groups from among its member-agencies will also be formed to address particular concerns relative to the implementation of this Order.

Finally, the task force will also prepare and submit to the President annual reports on the state of hunger, food security, nutrition and agricultural production in the country, as well as the task force's initiatives and recommendations.

Support and assistance of other government agencies and instrumentalities may also be sought by the task force. Meanwhile, local government units are enjoined to render necessary assistance to the task force.

Initial funding requirements for the implementation of this order will be charged against the current appropriations of the member-agencies of the task force.

However, budgetary requirements for the succeeding years will be included in the annual budget proposals of the concerned agencies.

The order takes effect immediately.

Based on the third quarter of 2019 Social Weather Stations (SWS) survey results fielded from Sept. 27 to 30, 2019, 9.1 percent or an estimated 2.3 million families experienced involuntary hunger at least once in the past three months.

The figure is lower than the 10 percent or an estimated 2.5 million in June 2019 and 9.5 percent or about 2.3 million families in March 2019.

Nograles expressed hope that fewer Filipinos will suffer from hunger with programs like the Enhanced Partnership Against Hunger and Poverty (EPAHP), an initiative to help mitigate hunger, ensure food and nutrition security, and reduce poverty in urban and rural communities, including marginalized communities.

Agencies which are a part of EPAHP are the Department of Social Welfare and Development, Department of Agrarian Reform, Department of Agriculture, the Department of the Interior and Local Government, Department of Education, Department of Health, Department of Science and Technology, Department of Trade and Industry, National Anti-Poverty Commission, National Irrigation Administration, and Landbank. DOH reminds public anew to wear dust masks vs. Taal ashfall

MANILA -- The Department of Health (DOH) reminded the public anew to keep their noses and mouths covered by wearing a dust mask to avoid asthma triggers and other respiratory diseases due to the ash fall from the eruption of Taal Volcano.

In a statement Monday night, the DOH said residents near Taal Volcano and in areas where volcanic ashes are thick must wear N95 masks while people living in places with less volcanic ashes may use a surgical mask, a piece of cloth, or a bandana to cover their noses and mouths. Apart from respiratory problems, the DOH said volcanic ashes can also harm the eyes, advising the public to remain indoors and avoid going outdoors unless during emergencies. "Magsuot ng salamin at goggles para protektahan ang mata sa ashfall. Iwasang gumamit ng contact lenses, kung maaari gumamit muna ng salamin (Wear eyeglasses and goggles to protect the eyes from ashfall.

PGC extends assistance to displaced Batangueños after Taal volcano explosion

Following the catastrophic phreatic explosion of Taal volcano on Sunday, January 12 severely affecting thousands of Batangas residents, the province of Cavite opened its doors to displaced families fleeing for safety. Although also affected by the heavy ashfall coming from the volcano, several LGUs in Cavite, initially Tagaytay City, the towns of Alfonso, Mendez, Amadeo and Gen. Aguinaldo offered temporary shelter and care to families coming from the affected areas in Batangas. As waves of evacuees continue to come in, other LGUs have also provided shelter and help to affected families.

The Provincial Government of Cavite on January 13, 2020 organized and facilitated the distribution of E-Balde to families in evacuation centers and temporary shelters of LGUs where the displaced Batangas residents are located. Each E-Balde consists of a hygiene kit (bath soap, shampoo, alcohol, deodorant, toothpaste, toothbrush, underwear, face towel, sanitary napkin, dishwashing liquid, detergent soap, sponge), 2 sardines, mosquito net, blanket, bath towel and water dipper all packed in a water pail.

Leading the distribution of relief assistance were the Provincial Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Office, the Provincial Social Welfare



and Development Office and the Provincial Government - Environment and Natural Resources Office with the support of other departments of the PGC. A total of 361 E-Balde were delivered in Tagaytay City while 432 were distributed in Alfonso. Fourteen (14) were delivered in the municipality of Mendez, 58 in Amadeo, and 100 in the town of Gen. Aguinaldo. Another batch of E-Balde were distributed on January 14 wherein 80 were delivered in the municipality of Maragondon, 10 in Ternate, 280 in Magallanes plus additional 25 E-Balde in Gen. Aguinaldo and 56 in Alfonso.

The provincial and other local disaster risks reduction and management offices of the different LGUs in Cavite also extended the necessary support from the onset of the explosion conducting rescue operations, transport of

evacuees and other immediate response activities. Regular coordination with LGUs and partner agencies is in place for necessary actions in the face of the recent adversity.

Relief operations are still ongoing as more evacuees are coming in to nearby municipalities. In a meeting with the heads of different departments of the provincial government, Governor Jonvic Remulla ordered the continuous monitoring of the situation as well as the condition of evacuees to be able to provide for their immediate needs. He stressed that in light of the disaster, Cavite will not turn its back on anyone and provide whatever it can for those affected.

The Sangguniang Panlalawigan also convened in a special session and passed SP Resolution No. 1389-2020 declaring the province of Cavite under State of Calamity and facilitating the release of Php 15M worth of quick response fund.

Coop i-Create Ladderized Training for cooperatives (LTC)

The Provincial Government of Cavite through the Provincial Cooperative, Livelihood and Entrepreneurial Development Office (PCLEDO) conducted the Coop i-Create, a Ladderized Training for Cooperatives (LTC) on January 10, 2020 at the Cavite Cooperative Development Center in Trece Martires City to provide an alternative way and profitable employment opportunities for individuals who aspire to have their own businesses. The program aims to identify potential entrepreneurs and provide them with comprehensive support to enhance their entrepreneurial skills and competencies to establish and operate their own competitive business on a sustainable basis.

Ms. Liza C. Gabatan, Entrepreneurial Head, PCLEDO welcomed the participants and gave the detailed and comprehensive overview of the training. The seminar-workshop proper



was facilitated by Dr. Aldrin P. Antivola, Business Efficiency Advisor/Organization Therapist. He clearly discussed Entrepreneurial Mindsetting which include the topics: Motivating a Cooperative to Start a Business, NACH – Need for Achievement, How to Develop an Entrepreneurial Mindset in 7 Days or Less, Understanding the “Law of Attraction” and Designing and Understanding a Business Model. During the program, the participants were able to get to know each other by sharing the name of their Cooperatives, locations, missions and visions and other pertinent data. The next sessions will be

scheduled on January 17, 23, 24 and February 18, 2020.

Meanwhile, Atty. Khervy B. Reyes, Officer-in-Charge, PCLEDO challenged the participants to reach more people and assured them that the PCLEDO employees will always be present to give assistance in order to achieve their goals.

Attended by 15 selected cooperatives with their Chairpersons and Managers, the participants were expected to gain competencies, learn the art of planning, and organize and execute their businesses with the goal of bringing competitive products to a wider market.

NFA releases rice for Taal Volcano victims

QUEZON CITY, - The National Food Authority initially released a total of 599 bags for distribution to victims of Taal Volcano eruption.

Tens of thousands of people from CALABARZON area were affected by the eruption of Taal Volcano last January 12, 2020. Residents from hardly hit areas of Batangas are now staying in evacuation centers set up by the government.

Local NFA offices in Cavite released 489 bags to the Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD); Batangas issued 50 bags to the local government of Taysan and 60 bags to the Lions Club of Batangas.

Meanwhile, the city

government of Valenzuela has signified its intention to buy 9,600 bags from the food agency for distribution also to the displaced families.

NFA Administrator Judy Carol L. Dansal assured that the food agency has enough rice stocks especially in the affected areas. The rice inventory in Region 4 (Southern Tagalog) stands at 1,930,000 bags; NCR has 197,000 bags and 1,963,000 bags for Region 3 (Central Luzon).

“We are ready to respond anytime to provide the rice requirements of various relief agencies and LGUs. We have a standing Memorandum of Agreement (MOA)

with relief agencies such as the DSWD, Office of Civil Defense and LGUs for the supply of their rice requirements for relief operations during natural disasters, calamities and other emergencies,” added Dansal.

She said that local NFA offices in Batangas, Cavite, Metro Manila and Central Luzon are on alert status and are closely coordinating with the LGUs and relief agencies for the issuance of rice for distribution to affected families and those in the evacuation centers. NFA Operation Centers were also activated to ensure a 24-hour response and regularly monitor the situations in the area. (NFA)

Inter-agency veterinary mission for animals affected by Taal volcano eruption

The Provincial Veterinary Office, Cavite headed by Dr. May Magno conducted an emergency meeting for the Inter-Agency Veterinary Mission for animals affected by the Taal volcano eruption on January 15, 2020 at the Sangguniang Panlalawigan Session Hall, Legislative Building, Trece Martires City. Discussed in the meeting were plan of actions that will address the condition of animals after the eruption.

In the meeting, it was

confirmed that there were no reported damages and deaths of farm animals and pets. The municipalities of Alfonso, Amadeo, Indang, Mendez, Silang and Tagaytay were identified as priority areas for the inter-agency veterinary mission based on the initial damage report submitted by cities and municipalities. Grasses and forages used as feeds in the said towns were all covered with volcanic ash posing imminent feeds shortage.

Partner agencies committed to provide veterinary supplies, medicines, animal feeds, logistics and other needs that may be needed in the mission. Donations in the form of dog food, powder and injectable medicines, veterinary supplies, bottled water and other items already started coming in as early as a day before the meeting was finalized.

Present during the meeting were representatives from the Bureau of Animal Industry (BAI), Department of Agriculture Region 4-A/
