DepEd: Schools may resort to remote learning during extreme heat

MANILA – The Department of Education (DepEd) reiterated on Monday that public schools are allowed to shift to alternative delivery modes (ADMs) should classroom setup is no longer ideal for learning amid the scorching heat.

In a Viber message, DepEd spokesperson Michael Poa said there are no adequate funds to install air conditioning in all

classrooms despite having maintenance and other operating expenses (MOOE) in schools.

PhilHealth rolls out expanded coverage, new benefits for members

MANILA – The Philippine Health Insurance Corporation (PhilHealth) is set to roll out its expanded coverage and benefits for its members.

Among the first to be implemented is the increase in the number of covered outpatient hemodialysis sessions from 90 to 156, PhilHealth acting president and chief executive officer Emmanuel R. Ledesma Jr. said in a news

release on Tuesday.

“Sa pamamagitan ng expanded coverage na ito para sa outpatient hemodialysis, masusuportahan na po natin ang buong tatlong sessions kada linggo sa loob ng isang buong taon. Ibinase po ng PhilHealth ang increase na ito batay sa standards ng adequate dialysis nangangailangan ng tatlong 4-hour sessions per week para sa (Through this expanded

coverage for outpatient hemodialysis, we can support three sessions per week for the whole year. PhilHealth based this increase from adequate dialysis standards of those who need three 4-hour sessions per week for stage 5 chronic kidney disease (CKD) patients,” Ledesma said.

As directed by President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr., Ledesma added that the state

as an outpatient therapeutic care package for severe acute malnutrition for children under five years old.

"We are committed to continuously improve the benefits we offer and make them more responsive, accessible, and convenient to the Filipino people," Ledesma said.

"One of these improvements is the introduction of the PhilHealth mobile app along with text message confirmations, so in the very near future your health care will just be a few taps away," he added.

Ledesma said they are also strengthening the PhilHealth Konsulta Package, where members are assigned to an accredited Konsulta provider whom they can consult for their health care needs.

"Ang PhilHealth Konsulta Package ay primary care benefit na maaaring magamit para sa basic services tulad

ng (The PhilHealth Konsulta Package is a primary care benefit that can be used for basic services like) check-up, health screening and assessment, laboratory, x-ray, at gamot (medicine)," he said.

Ledesma reiterated the agency's commitment to be responsive to the health and medical needs of Filipinos in the new normal.

He said PhilHealth plans to rationalize its Covid-19 in-patient packages, reverse transcription polymerase chain reaction (RT-PCR) and rapid antigen tests as well as isolation packages.

"We are also planning to rationalize select in-patient case rates, including moderate and high-risk pneumonia and acute ischemic and hemorrhagic, as these are the most common cases availed in recent years according to our records," he added. (PNA)

In its continuous thrust to capacitate persons with disability officers and focal persons in Cavite, the provincial government, thru the Office of the Provincial Governor – Office of the Provincial Persons with Disability Affairs Officer headed by PDAO Officer IV Marie Shiela Antenor-Haloc, initiated an Orientation of Disability Programs and Services and Agency Visits at the National Council on Disability Affairs (NCDA) and Resources for the Blind, Inc. (RBI) in Quezon City on April 20, 2023.

The learning visit aimed to familiarize participants with the selected agencies' programs and services and gain new insights into the delivery of effective programs and services for the disability sector.

The event was joined by almost 50 PWD advocates consisting of some of the members of the Provincial Council on Disability Affairs, headed by 1st District Board Member Romel R. Enriquez, PDAOs, and Persons with Disability focal persons from the different cities and municipalities in Cavite.

The team was warmly welcomed by NCDA Executive Director Joniro F. Fradejas. His message emphasized that individuals with disabilities themselves or social workers are the most suitable candidates to head the disability affairs office, as they possess a deep understanding of the needs and desires of people with special needs.

Mr. Randy Calseña, the Regional Programs Coordinator, discussed the programs and services including the policy formulation and program development coordination framework of the NCDA. Atty. Walter Jason Alava provided updates on disability laws such as RA 7277 or the Magna Carta for Disabled Persons, RA 11228, an Act Providing for the Mandatory PhilHealth Coverage for All PWDs, RA 10747, or the Rare Disease Act of the Philippines, and RA 10754, An Act Expanding the Benefits and Privileges of PWDs.

The highlight of the activity was a tour of the NCDA and Disability Resource and Development Center (DRDC) which was facilitated by Ms. Delfina Baquir and Atty. Walter Jason Alava, Regional Programs Coordinators, where the participants had a glimpse of some of their facilities and offices which include the Information, Education, and Communication Division, Office of the Executive Director, Broadcast Studio Room, Prayer Room, E-Library, and their ramp with breathtaking views that connects from the 7th floor to the ground.

Booster shots for 5-to-11-year-olds still not recommended: DOH

MANILA – Administration of Covid-19 booster shots to children aged five to 11 years old is still not recommended.

In a media briefing on Tuesday, Department of Health (DOH) officer-in-charge Undersecretary Maria Rosario Vergeire said the country's health experts studied the non-recommendation thoroughly based on scientific evidence.

"Kahit doon sa mga pag-aaral na nailabas nang WHO [World Health Organization], even other credible institutions, sinasabi na

walang value pa para makapagrekomenda tayo ng boosters sa ating mga kabataan (Even in the studies released by the WHO, even other credible institutions, it is said that there is still no value to recommend boosters for) 12 years old and below," she said.

"What is important is they are fully vaccinated because this continues to protect them against Covid-19," she added.

Last week, the administration of second booster shots for the general population or those who are healthy and aged 18 years old



and below began but there is no consolidated accomplishment report yet.

"Siguro po (Maybe) towards the end of the week, we can get our weekly accomplishment for our second booster shots," Vergeire said.

There would be no National Vaccination Days for the second boosters as the DOH has informed the public about it and regional offices of Centers for Health Development

have already identified health centers as vaccination sites, she added.

As of March 20, more than 78.4 million Filipinos have been fully vaccinated including 7.2 million senior citizens, 10.2 million adolescents, and 5.6 million children.

Meanwhile, about 23.8 million individuals have received their first booster shot and 4.4 million have received their second booster dose. (PNA)

Aside from the job opportunities, the DOLE will be setting up a one-stop-shop service of different government agencies, such as the Philippine Statistics Authority, National Bureau of Investigation, Bureau of Internal Revenue, Social Security System, Home Development Mutual Fund, Philippine Health Insurance Corporation and Philippine Postal Corporation in a bid to assist applicants to complete their pre-employment requirements. Always safeguard health of others, CSC tells new doctors

MANILA – Civil Service Commission (CSC) Chairperson Karlo Nograles has called on the country's 1,573 new doctors to always adhere to their solemn oath of safeguarding the health of others as they embark on their journey as licensed physicians.

Nograles made the call during the oath-taking ceremonies for the newly-minted doctors at the Philippine International Convention Center in Pasay City last April 19.

“(This day’s) oath-taking is not merely a ceremony to practice medicine; it is a solemn act and eternal promise to adhere closely to the ethical and professional values of the medical profession. As you begin your work as licensed physicians and realize your aspirations and your goals, may you always remember the reason for choosing this path, to safeguard the health of others,” said Nograles in his keynote speech.

He also reminded the new doctors not to compromise integrity as they live their dreams; to strive to pay it forward by being a mentor to others; and that public service is a public trust.

Nograles also said being a doctor goes beyond the practice as a means of livelihood.

“It is a vocation and a humanitarian calling to take the road less traveled to make a difference in the lives of the Filipino people,”

Nograles said, citing Dr. Jose Jonas D. Del Rosario from the Philippine General Hospital (PGH), and Dr. Annie Claire Pekas from Luis Hora Memorial Regional Hospital (LHMRH).

The two doctors were recognized and awarded by the CSC through its Honor Awards Program for their commitment to stay in public service despite the challenges brought about by the Covid-19 pandemic.

“Whether you choose to enter government or practice in private hospitals and institutions, as doctors, you are foremost, public servants, and you must, at all times, be accountable to the people; serve them with utmost responsibility, integrity, loyalty, and efficiency; act with patriotism and justice; and lead modest lives,” Nograles said.

CSC welcomes high trust, approval ratings

On Tuesday, Nograles expressed his gratitude to the Filipino people for trusting the agency as it performs its mandate as the central human resource agency of the Philippine government.

This after the results of the recent 2023 Pahayag First Quarter Survey by Publicus Asia conducted last March 2-6 showed that the CSC ranked 9th among the most trusted, and 10th among the most approved government agencies.

MANILA – Close to 60,000 jobs are up for grabs at the annual job fairs by the Department of Labor and Employment (DOLE) in connection with the celebration of Labor Day on May 1 nationwide.
