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## MIC to invest P19.7B for NGCP stake, hints at more deals ahead

MANILA — The Maharlika Investment Corporation (MIC), the manager of the country's first sovereign wealth fund, is set to invest PHP19.7 billion to acquire a 20-percent stake in the National Grid Corporation of the Philippines (NGCP), marking a significant step toward increasing government influence over the country's power grid operations.

In a Palace press briefing Tuesday, MIC President and CEO Rafael Consing Jr. announced that the funds will be used to purchase preferred shares at PHP15 each from Synergy Grid and Development Philippines Inc. (SGP), a key stakeholder in NGCP.

The preferred shares come with a guaranteed dividend yield of over 6.5 percent for the first three years of

the investment.

Consing explained that, after the initial three years, the investment could be converted into common shares, giving MIC greater flexibility and control over its stake in NGCP.

MIC said it is eyeing to finalize and sign transaction documents of its maiden investment within the next 90 days.

## GSIS infra investments deliver \$272-M boost to pension fund

MANILA — The Government Service Insurance System (GSIS) has received a significant USD272 million (approximately PHP15.8 billion) payout from the Macquarie Asia Infrastructure Fund 2 (MAIF2) as of Dec. 30, 2024, bolstering its pension fund's financial stability.

The payout follows the successful sale of MAIF2's stake in



AirTrunk, a prominent data center operator in the region.

With this latest cash inflow, the GSIS said it has fully recouped its initial investment in MAIF2, managed by Macquarie Asset Management (MAM).

On Monday, Malacañang announced that SGP has accepted a binding offer from MIC to secure a foothold in NGCP. The deal will give MIC two board seats each in the SGP and NGCP, the country's lone power transmission network.

According to Consing, the NGCP investment will be "100% primary shares."

"Ang ibig sabihin po niyan is kapag primary shares po, lahat po ng capital na i-invest po natin, pupunta diretso sa kumpanya para siya namang gamitin para pagsuporta sa rollout ng capex ng NGCP (Meaning, all capital invested will go directly to NGCP to support its capital expenditure rollouts)," he said.

**China firm shares**

Meanwhile, MIC said it is open to acquiring shares of the State Grid Corporation of China (SGCC) in the Philippines' power grid.

SGCC holds a commanding 40 percent

share in the NGCP.

"We have not spoken basically to the Chinese, we only saw this opportunity sa SGP level – we're not having any discussions with the State Grid of China at this point in time. So, no conversations are occurring with them," Consing said.

When pressed if the MIC is interested in acquiring the Chinese firm's shares in the NGCP, Consing said: "If it becomes available, I think so, yes."

More investments ahead

Consing also revealed that additional MIC investments are in the works.

While he did not provide specifics, he hinted that another significant deal could be announced in the next 30 days.

"We have, in fact, working on multiple transactions. In the next 30 days we could have another one," he told reporters. (PNA)

"This is good news for GSIS members as the funds are invested to earn solid returns, helping to boost the financial strength of the GSIS and its capacity to cover pension payments of retired civil servants in the future," GSIS President and General Manager Arnulfo "Wick" Veloso said in a news release on Tuesday.

"Our infrastructure investments through MAM's funds have delivered exceptional results, enhancing retirement security while supporting critical infrastructure," he

added.

The GSIS has partnered with MAM since 2012, beginning with investments in the Philippine Investment Alliance for Infrastructure (PINAI) to boost local infrastructure development.

It later expanded its portfolio by investing in MAM's regional infrastructure funds in 2017 and 2021, diversifying its holdings and driving long-term returns.

The GSIS maintains a balanced investment strategy, with 70 percent of its portfolio allocated to low-risk

is a seven-year foreign-assisted initiative funded by the World Bank.

It is being implemented in 11 provinces across the country, including the Calabarzon region, to address critical challenges in the fisheries sector and promote sustainable practices.

waste output, thus allowing them to tailor solutions that avoid over- or under-utilization of resources.

"The space for each fill has been studied because there are categories based from and how much they produce waste we call it Category 1 to Category 4. Usually, our municipalities [in Laguna] are only category 1, only a small amount of waste, maximum of 15 tonnes per day where they throw it on their sanitary landfill," Castillo explained.

Other municipalities and cities in the province have partnered with waste haulers and private landfill operators to address waste management more efficiently and aim to ensure that waste is properly collected, transported, and disposed of in compliance with environmental standards.

Though landfills in each municipality are

not mandated and are simply an initiative of the LGUs, Castillo has called on the public to at least actively participate in waste segregation and disposal efforts to ensure proper waste management.

"Waste management is not just a responsibility of municipalities or LGUs because the success of waste management is also up to us. I hope we always do waste segregation because if there is waste segregation, waste recovery will be easier and we will be able to help our informal waste sectors and in the same way, there will be less waste that is just dumped in sanitary landfills," he said.

The official added that if Lagunenses want to see real progress in waste management, everyone should do their part as discipline is also crucial in waste management. (AM, CH/PIA-4A)

MANILA – The country’s coconut industry got a big boost after the coconut was removed by the United States Food and Drug Administration (USFDA) from the list of major food allergens, a trade official said on Monday.

“The delisting of coconut as a major food allergen can boost demand for these products and encourage more producers and consumers to support coconut-based/containing products. This, in turn, will benefit our coconut farmers and exporters,” Department of Trade and Industry (DTI) - Export Marketing Bureau Director Bianca Pearl Sykimte said in a statement.

The DTI said the delisting would waive the requirement for coconut products, particularly coconut-containing packaged foods and supplements, to secure special allergen labeling under the US Food Allergen Labeling and Consumer Protection Act of 2004

(FALCPA).

This may cover an increased demand for coconut-based products such as refined and virgin coconut oil, coconut milk, desiccated coconut, coconut water, and coconut sugar, among others, it said.

Sykimte lauded the combined and continuous efforts of the DTI and the Department of Agriculture (DA), the Philippine Coconut Authority (PCA), and the private stakeholders in addressing the industry’s challenges.

“This progress underscores our commitment to support the development and growth of our coconut sector by addressing key market access and regulatory issues,” she said.

Citing Mintel’s global new product database from 2018 to 2023, the DTI official said over 20,000 coconut product variants are being used in the US as ingredients for food, drinks, and personal care products.

## No inappropriate topics in CSE, DepEd assures Senate panel

MANILA – Officials of the Department of Education (DepEd) on Tuesday clarified that abstinence and other family planning methods are presented as part of factual health and medical discussions within the comprehensive sexuality education (CSE) curriculum.

During the public hearing of the Basic Education panel on the rising number of adolescent pregnancies among the youth, education officials also refuted allegations that CSE teaches inappropriate topics to young learners, stressing that all lessons are age-appropriate and developmentally aligned.

“All competencies are mapped to existing learning objectives appropriate for the students’ age and development,” DepEd Assistant Secretary Janir Datukan assured senators, responding to concerns raised about the program’s content.

This, after Senate Deputy Minority Leader Risa Hontiveros highlighted the importance of addressing online sexual abuse, exploitation of children, and the role of comprehensive sexuality education in empowering youth and preventing teenage pregnancies.

Hontiveros also raised concerns about how abstinence is incorporated into CSE, urging a clearer discussion on methods of preventing pregnancy, human immunodeficiency virus (HIV) and other sexually transmitted infections (STIs).

“There should be a progressive discussion of abstinence alongside traditional and modern family planning methods as students mature,” she stated.

Hontiveros also

asked whether the Reproductive Health (RH) Law undermines parental authority over children’s sexual and reproductive health education.

In response, DepEd Undersecretary Filemon Ray Javier assured the committee that CSE is intended to complement, not replace, parental guidance.

“CSE is supplementary. It does not supplant or override parental authority,” Javier explained.

Hontiveros likewise sought details about parent orientations, teacher training, and challenges in implementing CSE as mandated by DepEd Order No. 31, Series of 2018, and the RH Law.

Hontiveros noted DepEd’s earlier report of training over 11,000 parent representatives on CSE in various regions, asking for a detailed breakdown of schools and teachers involved.

She emphasized the program’s inclusivity, stating that it should benefit not only students but also parents, guardians, and teachers.

DepEd Assistant Secretary Dexter Galban

responded that approximately 400,000 teachers had been trained on CSE, particularly in sensitive topics, to enhance their ability to teach older students.

“The universe of teachers in DepEd is over 800,000, and we’ve trained roughly half so far,” Galban said.

However, he acknowledged gaps in coverage, as DepEd oversees only students within school premises, leaving out-of-school youth unserved.

He added that challenges include unfamiliarity with CSE content among teachers, and coordination with other government agencies, such as the Department of Health and the Department of Social Welfare and Development, to address issues like teenage pregnancy and child exploitation.

Senator Sherwin Gatchalian, chair of the panel, emphasized the importance of strengthening CSE and integrating preventive measures into the basic education system to better equip students for these challenges.

## DPWH beefs up construction, repair of flood control projects in Calabarzon

CALAMBA CITY, Laguna (PIA) – The Department of Public Works and Highways (DPWH) in Calabarzon has acknowledged the need to establish resilient flood control structures in the region due to recent destructive typhoons that hit the country.

DPWH Region IV-A director Jovel Mendoza said that the department has finished the construction and repair of 1,155 flood control projects in the region funded under the General Appropriations Act from 2023 to 2025 worth Php69.9 billion.

Mendoza said the DPWH has conducted studies to make sure that the projects can withstand the maximum effects of stronger typhoons and higher storm surges.

“We are conducting detailed estimates and designs for our damaged flood control structures especially in the past year because



there have been a lot of typhoons that had devastating effects,” the director said.

In a special meeting by the Calabarzon Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council (RDRRMC) last December 5, local governments around the Laguna de Bay said that lake waters would swamp neighboring communities due to rains being dumped by stronger typhoons, water pollution, and problems on drainage and infrastructure systems.

The DPWH had acknowledged that floods in road net-

works have disrupted public transportation especially during times of disaster.

“Rest assured that we have requested [the repairs], some are requested under the Office of Civil Defense while some are requested under regular funds,” Mendoza explained.

The flood control projects that were partially damaged will be repaired and implemented under the 2025 GAA while most projects are under the regular process of procurement. (CH/PIA-Laguna)

Meanwhile, coconut stakeholders welcomed the development and underscored the need for science-based information in global policy-making.

“It is a welcome development and great news for the coconut industry, not only in the Philippines but globally. The issue on food allergens has been running for decades. Finally removing coconut as a tree nut eliminates one issue against it. This is the result of a joint private-government sector effort,” United Coconut Associations of the Philippines (UCAP) Executive Director Yvonne Agustin said.

Peter Paul Philippine Corporation Sales, Marketing and Export Vice

President Dr. Rhoey Lee Dakis said the USFDA decision provides much-needed clarity for consumers, manufacturers, and the broader industry.

“It ensures that coconut products are no longer subject to unnecessary allergen labeling or misconceptions... We believe this progress will further strengthen the global coconut industry by removing barriers and offering consumers accurate, reliable information,” Dakis said.

To date, coconut products remain the country’s top export, amounting to USD524.92 million from January to October 2024, according to the Philippine Statistics Authority. (PNA)
