# Champion homegrown products, Marcos urges Filipinos

MANILA – President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr. called on Filipinos to actively support and take pride in local food products, emphasizing the importance of championing homegrown businesses to drive the nation's economic growth.

Speaking at the Bagong Pilipinas National Food Fair on Wednesday, Marcos urged Filipinos to recognize the brilliance of the country's cu-

linary heritage as he acknowledged the Filipino Food Month celebration this April.

"This April, we are celebrating the Filipino Food Month, an important occasion where we honor valued traditions passed down through generations, reflecting our identity as Filipinos through the food that we prepare and enjoy," Marcos said.

The Chief Executive also recognized the

growing global admiration for Filipino cuisine, urging the public to take pride in their own culinary heritage.

"Marami na rin ang mga dayuhan na humahanga sa kakaibang sarap ng ating mga pagkain. Kaya sana, tayo namang mga Pilipino mismo ang manguna sa pagkikilala sa mga putahe at lutong Pinoy," he said, encouraging Filipinos to lead the recognition of

## Batangas blood council lauded for support to nat'l blood donation program

BATANGAS CITY (PIA) — The Department of Health (DOH) Calabarzon has commended the Batangas Provincial Blood Council for its contributions to the National Voluntary Blood Services Program.

Recognizing the province's consistent efforts in promoting safe and sufficient blood supply, the regional health office highlighted Batangas' remarkable blood collection performance, which reached 170.2 percent in 2024 — a



notable rise from 137 percent in 2023.

According to DOH Calabarzon, the council has played a vital role in blood donation advocacy, benefiting not only Batangas but the entire Calabarzon Region. The World Health Organization

recommends that blood collection must reach at least 1 percent of a population to meet regional needs — a benchmark that Batangas has far exceeded.

Composed of various government agencies, local offices, and institutions from the health

and academic sectors, the Batangas Provincial Blood Council has been instrumental in mobilizing support across the province.

Several local government units (LGUs) were also recognized for their strong backing of the blood donation drive. The Red Category Award, granted to LGUs that met the 1 percent target, was awarded to the municipalities of San Nicolas, Malvar, Balayan, and Nasugbu.

## DFA: 1 Filipino confirmed dead in Myanmar quake

MANILA – The Department of Foreign Affairs (DFA) on Wednesday confirmed the death of one Filipino in Myanmar following the 7.7 magnitude earthquake that struck the Southeast Asian country last month.

DFA Undersecretary Eduardo Jose de Vega, in a statement, said the remains of one of the four missing Filipinos "have been positively

identified" in Myanmar's central city of Mandalay.

"The family of the deceased Filipino has been so informed. Out of respect for their privacy in this time of grief, we are withholding further information on the matter," he said.

The Philippine government, he said, continues to work and hopes for the best for the remaining three (Turn to p. 2)

proved Child Care Center.

This Child Care Center is designed as a safe and nurturing space where parents can leave their children while they attend to their everyday responsibilities.

It offers a child-friendly environment equipped with play areas, learning materials, and professional caregivers, ensuring the holistic well-being of the children.

"Parents who wish to enroll their children in the Child Care Center can do so through the Municipal Social Welfare and Development (MSWD) office. Upon registration, they are required to specify the duration of their child's stay. The center operates from 8:00 AM to 5:00 PM, aligning with the typical

work hours of parents to accommodate their schedules," municipal information officer John Marvin Canaria said in a statement.

The LB government reveals the modern amenities in the center include designated play areas equipped with child-safe playground structures, shade canopies, a nap room, and dedicated seating for guardians.

The educational and recreational center also offers storytelling sessions, arts and crafts activities, and early childhood development programs.

To ensure the highest level of care and supervision, the personnel at the Child Care Center underwent a careful selection process. Caregivers must be registered nurses,

while teachers are not strictly required to have an education degree, as long as they have completed a four-year college course.

Moreso, the facility will help solo parents by offering parenting workshops, job placement programs, and mental health support services, ensuring they have the necessary resources to balance work and childcare effectively.

"It is one of the programs he really did for solo parents? Because, aside from the subsidies that they get from the government, this is one of the things that can really help our solo parents in different ways," Canaria stated.

Unlike traditional daycare centers, the Los Baños Child Care Center provides a more

spacious environment where children can play freely.

On April 3, President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr. witnessed the ceremonial signing of the Joint Circular on the Establishment of Child Development Centers (CDCs) between the Department of Education (DepEd) and the Department of Budget and Management (DBM).

The Joint Circular provides guidelines for LGUs to establish CDCs funded through the Local Government Support Fund – Financial Assistance to LGUs (LGSF-FA), which aims to improve access to early childhood care and development facilities, particularly in low-income areas. (AM,CA/PIA-4A)

DTI chief: No retaliation over new US tariff on PH goods

MANILA — Trade Secretary Ma. Cristina Roque said the Philippines would not retaliate against the recently imposed 17-percent tariff on certain Philippine goods entering the US market as part of Trump's "liberation day".

Speaking to reporters on the sidelines of the National Food Fair in Mandaluyong City on Wednesday, Roque said the Marcos administration prefers a constructive approach focused on strengthening trade ties with the US.

"No, we don't have any of those (retaliation). We just move on a positive note, and we really have more trade between our country and the US," she said.

The Asian Development Bank earlier warned that retaliatory measures by developing countries could reduce regional gross domestic product (GDP) growth by

0.1 percentage point in both 2025 and 2026.

The Philippines, as part of developing Asia, could be affected by any escalation of trade tensions.

The country's top trade official is set to join a virtual meeting of ASEAN Economic Ministers on Thursday to discuss the bloc's ways forward following Trump's tariff order that took effect on April 9.

"We have a meeting on Thursday with the different ministers of ASEAN, and let's see what we can agree on there, and see what we can do to be able to work hand in hand as ASEAN," Roque added.

Following a Cabinet-level meeting on April 8, the country's economic team agreed to first listen to the positions of other ASEAN member states before finalizing its stance.

Roque also floated the possibility of lowering tariffs on US imports as a gesture of goodwill, in the hope that Washington might reconsider its decision. "This could be an opportunity for both

countries to open discussions on a potential free trade agreement that would eliminate certain tariffs and enhance economic cooperation," she added. (PNA)

New York retains crown as world's wealthiest city

ANKARA – New York retained its title as the wealthiest city on the planet, according to the 2025 World's Wealthiest Cities Report released Tuesday by Henley & Partners in collaboration with New World Wealth.

Boasting 384,500 millionaires, 818 centi-millionaires and 66 billionaires, the Big Apple remained a magnet for global wealth, the report showed.

The report ranked cities by the number of high-net-worth individuals (HNWIs),

centi-millionaires and billionaires residing in those locations.

Hot on New York's heels is the Bay Area, which includes San Francisco and Silicon Valley, ranked second with 342,400 millionaires.

The region is now home to 82 billionaires, surpassing New York in that category.

The Bay Area's millionaire population has grown by 98 percent in the past decade, reflecting its position as a hub for technological wealth creation.

## DepEd launches summer programs to address learning gaps

MANILA – The Department of Education (DepEd) on Thursday launched the 2025 Summer Programs to address learning gaps in basic education.

The programs include Bawat Bata Makababasa Program, Literacy Remediation Program, Summer Academic Remedial Program, Regional Remediation Program, and 2025 Learning Camp.

This is in line with the directives of President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr. to advance quality education among learners and ensure the well-being of teachers.

In a statement, Education Secretary Sonny Angara said the summer programs “are designed to provide the necessary support and resources to help learners overcome challenges and achieve their full potential.”

He added that these programs will be done through interactive tutorials and targeted activities, focusing on “phonics, fluency, vocabulary, and comprehension” for reading; and “number sense, basic operations, and problem-solving” for mathematics.

Angara also reiterated that teachers participating in the 2025 Summer Programs will be granted vacation service credits (VSC) and professional recognition on top of the 30 days maximum service credits for teachers.

“We recognize that our teachers are at the heart of learning recovery. These incentives are a way to val-



ue their dedication and expertise, particularly during the summer break,” he said.

The DepEd said the 20-day Bawat Bata Makababasa Program will grant tutorials for reading proficiency among Grades 1 to 3 learners.

It will be piloted in public schools in areas affected by the unrest of Mt. Kanlaon in Western and Central Visayas, as well as in the Zamboanga Peninsula.

Moreover, Grade 3 learners identified as Low Emerging based on the Comprehensive Rapid Literacy Assessment (CRLA) results for end-of-school-year 2024-2025 will undergo Literacy Remediation Program to be implemented nationwide.

Exemptions for the Literacy Remediation Program, however, are 10 schools included in 2025 Learning Camp;

Kanlaon-affected schools divisions in Western and Central Visayas; and Zamboanga Peninsula.

Regional Remediation Program, meanwhile, will continue to provide support for reading and mathematics to learners, the DepEd said.

Grades 4 to 12 learners who failed a subject or two will undergo the Summer Academic Remedial Program.

Lastly, the four-week 2025 Learning Camp will be implemented in 10 select schools to serve as a learning recovery initiative for Grades 1 to 10 learners.

These 10 schools will come from MATATAG Pilot Regions including Metro Manila, Ilocos, Cagayan Valley, Central Visayas, Soccsksargen, Cordillera Administrative Region, and Caraga. (PNA)

## PBBM to Filipinos: Show valor through compassion, kindness

MANILA – President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr. called on Filipinos to honor the legacy of national heroes by embracing compassion, kindness, and selflessness as the country commemorates Araw ng Kagitingan (Day of Valor) on Wednesday.

In his message, Marcos paid tribute to the Filipino and American forces who fought valiantly during World War II, particularly recalling the 1942 Fall of Bataan.

“Their remarkable story continues to inspire us all as we carry on their work of protecting our nation and building a country worthy of their sacrifice,” Marcos said.

The Day of Valor commemorates the heroism and sacrifice of Filipinos during World War II and recalls the fall of Bataan, when Filipino and American forces surrendered to the Japanese Imperial Army after resisting for months with limited weapons, ammunition, and supplies.

The President emphasized that the commemoration is not only about remembering the physical strength and bravery displayed by those who fought,

“Valor is not solely about strength and resolve in the face of adversity but also about small acts of compassion, generosity, and kindness that create meaningful ripples of positive change in our communities,” he said.

The Chief Executive urged Filipinos to continue following the example of past heroes by advancing causes that uplift their fellow

countrymen.

“Through acts of genuine service and self-offering to the nation, we can prove that we are not only made of the same noble stock as our noteworthy ancestors but also the rightful heirs of their heroic legacy and the faithful successors of their struggle to build a strong, secure, and prosperous Bagong Pilipinas,” he said.

Marcos will lead the Day of Valor rites in Bataan on Wednesday morning.

He will also lead a ceremony in Camp Aguinaldo for the beneficiaries of the Comprehensive Social Benefits Program, a government initiative that provides various types of benefits and assistance to uniformed personnel killed or wounded in the line of duty. (PNA)

MANILA – Far Eastern University downed Ateneo de Manila University, 25-21, 19-25, 25-23, 25-23, Wednesday in the UAAP Season 87 men's volleyball tournament at the Philsports Arena in Pasig City to secure a twice-to-beat incentive in the Final Four.

Amet Samuel Bituin finished with 17 points on 16 attacks and one ace, and had nine receptions as the Tamaraws stayed on top of the standings at 11-1.

"Yesterday during practice, coach tried to have me start. Even though I was a bit confused, I just trusted the coaching staff and my teammates who supported me even when I was feeling down," Bituin, a product of FEU-Diliman High School, said after the match.

Dryx Saavedra had two attacks, Congolese middle blocker Doula Ndongala scored on a block and Bituin fired an ace to give the Tamaraws a 17-10 lead in the fourth set.

Ateneo rallied behind Jian Matthew Salarzon and MVP frontrunner Kennedy Batas to move within 20-22, but FEU won the next three points, the last one coming from Bi-

## PNP cautions public on road congestion during Holy Week, summer break

CALAMBA CITY, Laguna (PIA) — Authorities have reminded motorists to stretch their patience on the road especially this time of the year when travelers troop to ports and stations for the Holy Week pilgrimage, and the summer break.

Brig. Gen. Paul Kenneth Lucas, police regional director for Calabarzon, said that this season often causes heavy road congestion as devotees visit churches and tourists head to the region's popular destinations.

"For our fellow kababayans who will be going to tourist spots and for the devotees visiting well-known churches, expect heavy traffic. We anticipate congestion. Although our police will be assisting, we really cannot avoid that kind of traffic," Lucas said.

Following a recent road rage incident in Antipolo City, Rizal between drivers of a sports utility vehicle and motorcycle, the police executive also advised the public to remain calm and patient on the roads, particularly during peak travel times.

He also emphasized



that maintaining composure may prevent minor incidents from escalating into more serious situations.

To ensure the safety of motorists and manage the expected influx of travelers in the region, the Police Regional Office 4A has rolled out Oplan SumVac during Holy Week and the summer vacation.

"Preparations have been reinforced based on insights and observations from last year's operations to ensure smoother and safer travel. This includes cooperation with various government agencies, such as the local government units, Bureau of Fire Protection, Bureau of Jail Management and Penology, and the Armed Forces of the Philippines," Lucas said.

Strategic areas such as beaches, pilgrimage

sites, and prominent churches have been identified as high-traffic zones for both pedestrians and vehicles.

To immediately address public safety concerns, police assistance hubs and checkpoints are being set up in strategic areas, and ambulances and patrol vehicles will be deployed at tourist spots.

Aside from these precautionary measures, Lucas also encourages travelers to bring plenty of water and food to stay hydrated and avoid unnecessary stress in case of heavy traffic.
