DSWD on standby to provide aid to public on ‘Semana Santa’

MANILA – The Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD) on Tuesday assured the public that all its disaster management and response teams from the Central Office and 16 field offices will be on standby for any incident that may require the agency's immediate assistance during the observance of this year's Holy Week or “Semana Santa.”

“As directed by DSWD Secretary Rex Gatchalian, quick response teams of the

Department will remain on standby the entire Holy Week, ready for deployment should any event necessitate their intervention,” Assistant Secretary Irene Dumlaao of the DSWD's Disaster Response Management Group (DRMG) said in a statement.

“We want nothing but a peaceful observance of the Holy Week. But of course, disasters, whether natural or human-induced, may happen anytime. With this, we assure

the public that our resources can be tapped and delivered immediately when the need arises.”

She said they are closely coordinating with the Philippine Atmospheric, Geophysical and Astronomical Services Administration and other concerned agencies to monitor weather systems that may affect the country in the coming days.

Meanwhile, Dumlaao reminded the public to prioritize their safety. **(Turn to p. 2)**

DepEd intensifies efforts vs. ‘alarming rise’ in bullying

MANILA – The Department of Education (DepEd) on Tuesday said intensified efforts and collaboration with other government agencies are underway to combat bullying.

DepEd Secretary Sonny Angara led the largest executive committee (execom) meeting to discuss the issue of the “alarming” increase in bullying incidents in public schools in the country.

Angara said the government and other stakeholders must prioritize addressing the matter.

Don't take advantage of Lenten demand surge, fish vendors told

MANILA – The Department of Agriculture (DA) on Tuesday called on fish retailers to avoid taking advantage of consumers amid the observance of Holy Week.

This comes with the expected increase in demand for fish and

other seafood as most Catholics abstain from eating meat, especially during Good Friday.

In an interview, DA deputy spokesperson Assistant Secretary Joycel Panlilio said the highest recorded prices of fish products in local markets should

not exceed further.

communities where our learners come from. This is not just a school matter, it is a national priority that demands a whole-of-government, whole-of-society response,” Angara said in a statement.

To date, reported bullying cases surged to 2,500 in Academic Year 2024-2025 from 2,268 cases in 2023-2024, according to the DepEd-National Capital Region.

Some of DepEd's

partner agencies are the Philippine National Police (PNP), Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD), Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG), and Department of Justice (DOJ).

Among the measures include PNP's intervention in bullying cases with legal violations, increased police visibility, and installation of security cameras in high-risk schools;

establishment of the Parent Effectiveness Office under DSWD for investigation of cases; and educating families in addressing root causes.

The DILG and DOJ, meanwhile, raised the possible activation of the Barangay Juvenile Intervention Program, which will help prevent bullying through diversion and rehabilitation at the community level.

DA monitors veggies, other agri goods production as heat indexes soar

MANILA – The Department of Agriculture (DA) on Tuesday assured close monitoring of the production and prices of vegetables and other agricultural commodities as the country deals with the scorching summer.

The Philippine Atmospheric, Geophysical and Astronomical Services Administration (PAGASA) earlier predicted 43 to 44 degrees Celsius heat indexes in several areas in Cavite, Metro Manila, Batangas, Pangasinan, Bulacan, Isabela, Mindoro, and Zamboanga del Norte.

"Lahat naman po ay tinutukan natin kasi dahil po sa init na supply sa merkado (We will make sure that there's enough supply in the market) this coming Holy Week," she said.

She also assured continuous close monitoring of fish prices in the local markets.

As of Monday, prices of milkfish in Metro Manila range from PHP140 per kilogram to PHP250 per kg.; PHP120 per kg. to PHP180 per kg. for tilapia; PHP180 per kg. to PHP320 per kg. of galunggong, according to the DA Bantay Presyo. (PNA)

She said most HVCs are sourced from the Cordillera Administrative Region (CAR), Ilocos and Cagayan Valley.

Panlilio assured preventive actions against potential agricultural damage due to extreme heat.

"We make sure po na meron tayong mga interventions na binibigay para maiwasan po itong effect ng pag-init ng ating panahon (that we have interventions being

implemented to prevent the effects of the hot weather)," Panlilio said.

She said the preventive measures include the utilization of plastic mulch as vegetable beds, a small pump irrigation system, drip water fertigation technology, and adequate rainwater reserve in rainwater shelters.

For poultry and livestock, Panlilio said animals must be protected from extreme heat exposure.

"Iyong mga animals ay sisiguruduhin po natin nasa tamang mga shelter sila para hindi naman po sila masyadong ma-expose sa heat na maaaring mag-cause din po sa kanila ng sakit (We will ensure that our animals are in proper shelters so they will not be exposed to heat which can cause them disease)," she said.

Aid to Kanlaon-affected farmers

Panlilio, meanwhile, assured aid for farmers affected by the eruption of Mt. Kanlaon in Negros Occidental.

"We give our usual interventions kapag kaya na po nila ult na magtaniam ay iyong mga agricultural inputs natin like 'yung mga seed po and meron naman kasi kaming (if they can already replant, including agricultural inputs like seeds and we also have a) quick response fund for this," she said.

Besides the distribution of seedlings, drugs, and biologics, the DA also prepared a PHP25,000 loanable amount under the Survival and Recovery loan program, payable in three years at zero interest; as well as the

NFA: PH on track to food security goal with sufficient rice reserves

MANILA – The Philippines is on track to achieving food security, particularly in rice supply, with the country's buffer stock now sufficient for over nine days, the National Food Authority (NFA) said Tuesday.

In a press briefing in Malacañang, NFA Administrator Larry Lacson said the Marcos administration's food security targets are being met, citing significant improvements in the country's rice reserves.

"Kung ang bigas ang ating pag-uusapan, ako masasabi ko na we are on track, in fact, in less than a year from one day to last buffer stock, ngayon po ay 9.36 na (If we're talking about rice, I can say we are on track. In fact, in less than a year, we've

increased our buffer stock from one day to now 9.36 days)," Lacson said.

"So, we are on track and we are continuously increasing our buffer stock for rice, as we all know, rice is the main gauge of food security," he added.

Lacson also disclosed plans to expand the rice buffer stock to 15 days this year, in line with amendments to the Rice Tariffication Law.

Currently, the coun-

try holds 358,000 metric tons of rice, equivalent to 7.16 million bags -- enough to feed the entire population for 9.36 days in case of emergency or supply disruption, according to the NFA chief.

As of March 31, the NFA has bought 2.2 million bags of palay from farmers nationwide, amounting to PHP2.6 billion.

DOH: Elderly, kids, sick people more prone to heat-linked illnesses

MANILA – The Department of Health (DOH) on Tuesday warned Filipinos anew against health conditions brought about by hot weather and high heat index.

In a Palace briefing, Health Secretary Teodoro Herbosa said heat-related illnesses such as dehydration, heat cramps, heat exhaustion and heat stroke can affect anyone, but certain populations are more susceptible.

Symptoms include dizziness, fever, numbness, fainting, and warm and reddish skin.

"Prone ang matanda, 'yung mga bata at may mga illnesses (The senior citizens, children and people who are already sick are prone to heat-related illnesses). So, make sure that these people

do not stay in [a] hot environment," he said.

According to the United States Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, bodies of old people are less efficient at regulating temperature, which include sweating and blood flow to the skin.

Moreover, their bodies take more time to adjust to sudden changes in temperature.

Meanwhile, children have a higher metabolism, producing more heat and losing heat quickly. This makes them more prone to dehydration.

Diabetes, heart disease, and obesity can affect a person's ability to regulate body temperature or respond to heat. Moreover, certain medications could interfere with body temperature regulation and sweat production.

"It [heat-related illness] starts with either thirst, severe thirst, you can have a lot of cold sweats. Eventually, if you're unable to correct that, you will collapse," Herbosa

said. "If you're thirsty, drink water. If you feel weak, fatigue is the next step after thirst, heat fatigue or heat weakness, mag-shade ka na or mag-aircon ka na (go to a shaded area or in an air-conditioned room)," he added.

While heat-related illnesses could lead to an emergency, Herbosa noted that the majority of patients easily recover with prompt and proper treatment.

The public is advised to stay indoors from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m., drink plenty of water, wear light clothing, and to use sunscreen, hats, umbrellas, and fans to avoid heat-related illnesses. (PNA)

Rizaleños find hope in PBBM's Trabaho at Serbisyon Pangkalusugan

Beneficiaries of the Trabaho at Serbisyon Pangkalusugan sa Bagong Pilipinas (Jobs and Health Services for a New Philippines) have expressed gratitude to the national government for bringing employment opportunities, medical services and other forms of assistance within reach of ordinary citizens.

These stories illustrate how accessible government initiatives can transform lives, especially for those who have long been marginalized or overlooked.

For Perla Magbato, a 43-year-old resident of Barangay San Luis, her journey from part-time housekeeper to landing a job through the government initiative serves as an inspiration and a testament to her resilience.

Magbato, a member of the Pantawid Pamilyang Pilipino Program (4Ps), was hired on the spot at the Trabaho, Serbisyo, at Pangkalusugan sa Bagong Pilipinas event in Antipolo City, Rizal.

The program serves as a one-stop shop for various government agencies and services, aimed at providing assistance such as job matching, medical consultations and free medicine, as well as financial aid for beneficiaries.

Magbato emphasized the importance of participating in government programs, believing that they truly help people. She also expressed her gratitude to President Ferdinand Marcos Jr. for the opportunity and is hopeful for success in her new job.

"I am thankful for the opportunity and for the continuous support of the government in meeting our needs. People should not be shy to go to government programs and



agencies; they are here to help people like me," she said.

As a first-time job seeker, her dream gave her strength not to give up. She trusted the process and was hired as a massage therapist at a clinic in Antipolo City. In addition to the job opportunity, she also received 5,000 pesos in financial aid as pre-employment assistance for her job requirements.

Melinda Sosoryo Bloece, 56, from Upang, Antipolo, Rizal, also thanked the government for bringing financial, medical and other services directly to residents.

Like many Filipino mothers, she has faced financial struggles in supporting her family's daily needs and her children's education. That is why she is very thankful for being part of the 4Ps program, which has helped her make ends meet.

"I'm very thankful to President Marcos because he's able to help us. As a 4Ps member, the aid we receive is a big relief. I usually use my payout as capital for selling vegetables in our area," she said.

As a recipient of government programs, she feels a sense of relief when her husband is out of work. With three children still in school, Bloece is also grateful that she can support their education without constantly worrying about tuition fees and daily expenses.

"When my husband doesn't have a job, we

can still buy rice and food because of the payout. Because of the financial assistance I get from 4Ps, I can pay for my children's tuition and give them money or food to bring to school."

Bloece expressed immense gratitude to the government for making a difference in her family's life and for the continued support she receives. She also encourages her fellow beneficiaries to spend their aid wisely.

"As a 4Ps member, we receive financial assistance. I hope others will not use it for other purposes. They should use it for their children's future and for food."

She hopes government assistance continues, as it greatly helps fellow citizens meet their needs and improve their quality of life.

The stories of Magbato and Bloece demonstrate the impact of government support and serve as an inspiration, showing that there is always hope to rise from poverty.

During an engagement in Cavite, President Marcos reaffirmed the government's commitment to extending services and assistance to the people, especially those who need them most.

"Rest assured that your government is always here, always supporting all of you. Rest assured, we will not leave as long as you need help from the government," the President said. (KA/PIA-4A)

MPTC Gears up for Holy Week with the "Biyaheng Arangkada" Motorist Assistance Program

- Utilize the MPT DriveHub app for quick and convenient balance checks and toll fee calculations.

- If your RFID is unreadable, have it checked and replaced at designated service centers.
