Palace vows prompt aid amid oil, fertilizer price hike concerns

MANILA – The government is ready to provide immediate assistance and interventions amid fears that the conflict in the Middle East could affect the prices of oil and fertilizers, Malacañang said on Tuesday.

Palace Press Officer Claire Castro said President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr. has already ordered the close mon-

itoring of the latest developments in the Middle East, amid increasing hostilities between Iran and Israel.

“(Ang direktiba ng Pangulo ay) i-monitor pong mabuti kung ano ang sitwasyon para po makapagbigay ng agarang solusyon at kahit papaano po ay ayuda kung talaga pong sobrang tataas ang presyo ng krudo (The President’s directive

is to carefully monitor the situation so that we can provide immediate solutions and at least some aid, if the price of crude oil really increases too much,” Castro said in a Palace

press briefing.

Castro said the Department of Energy is closely monitoring the situation in the Middle East and has required oil companies to submit a 30-day inventory of fuel.

She said the government would release fuel subsidies if the price of crude oil reaches more than USD80 per barrel.

“Kapag po tumaas ang presyo ng crude

oil ng mahigit sa USD80 per barrel, ang ayuda for fuel for public, transport and fisherfolk ay mati-trigger po (If the price of crude oil increases by more than USD80 per barrel, the aid for fuel for public, transport and fisherfolk will be triggered),” she said.

CvSU’s techno demo farm to strengthen agri innovation in Cavite

INDANG, Cavite (PIA) — The Cavite State University (CvSU) reaffirmed its commitment to agricultural innovation and education by partnering with the Department of Agriculture (DA) Calabarzon to establish an integrated Techno Demo Farm for research, training, and sustainable farming.

According to CvSU, the farm to be developed on a 1.3-hectare portion of CvSU’s STAR Farm in Indang, is expected to strengthen agricultural innovation and education by promoting sustainable



farming practices, advancing research, and empowering local farmers and students with modern technologies and skills.

“The initiative also seeks to address pressing issues related to food security, climate-resilient agriculture, and the competitiveness of local

farmers in an evolving agribusiness landscape,” CvSU said in a statement.

Under the partnership, CvSU and DA Calabarzon will collaborate in sharing knowledge and resources while implementing programs that promote sustainable farming technologies

and agribusiness development.

These efforts will include instruction, research, extension services, and the monitoring and evaluation of activities, policies, and technologies related to the project.

“This partnership with DA Calabarzon aligns with CvSU’s mandate to conduct research and extension services, and to provide progressive leadership in agriculture, science and technology, education, and other related fields,” CvSU added.

Israel hoping to fly home 17 PH officials within this week

MANILA – The Israeli government is hoping to fly home “within the week” the 17 Filipino officials currently stranded in the Jewish state as its conflict with Iran intensifies on its fifth day.

Irit Savion Waider-

gorn, deputy head of Israeli international aid agency MASHAV, said the 17 have all signified their intention to return to the Philippines as soon as possible.

“They’re safe. They’re with our team — their accommodations, their

meals, all their needs are being catered. There are safe rooms and public shelters in their hotel, and whenever is needed, they go there, and they’re very safe there,” she said in a phone interview on Tuesday night.

would be notified if there is a need to grant aid.

She said DOE officer in charge, Undersecretary Sharon Garin, would also hold a dialogue with oil companies if the situation exacerbates.

“Kung sobra daw po talaga ang pagtaas at hindi maiwasan, makikipag-usap ang DOE sa oil companies para ma-maintain ‘yung inventory levels at hangga’t maaari ay mai-spread out ang oil price adjustments. Iyan po ay syempre boluntaryo po at nasa magandang pakikipag-usap po iyan (If the increase is really excessive and unavoidable, the DOE will talk to the oil companies to maintain inventory levels and spread out the oil price adjustments as much as possible. That is of

course voluntary, and when the negotiation goes well),” Castro said.

She said the DA is also ready to import fertilizers from other countries, such as Brunei, in case there is disruption in Gulf shipping of the supply from Qatar.

Qatar, one of the Philippines’ major suppliers, sits only 510 miles from Iran.

”Nakikita rin naman po ng DA na hindi naman ito magdudulot ng pang-matagalang problema, lalo na kung hindi naman isasara ‘yung sea lanes. Kaya, ipagdasal na lang natin iyon (The DA also sees that this will not cause long-term problems, especially if the sea lanes are not closed. So, let’s just pray for that),” Castro said. (PNA)

(OSAEC), a growing concern in communities nationwide.

The collaboration outlines a multi-sectoral approach involving community stakeholders to implement awareness campaigns, educational initiatives for parents and children, training for local authorities, and the development of victim support systems.

Mayor Maricel Echevarria-Torres said the partnership marks the beginning of meaningful programs aimed at protecting the youth.

“Through this collaboration, our barangays, schools, service providers, and parents will be trained to help create a safer, more dignified future for our

children,” she said.

She expressed optimism that the initiative will serve as a model for other municipalities seeking to address the rising threat of online child exploitation through community-based solutions and sustained collaboration.

For Save the Children Philippines, the partnership is a “crucial step” in its Protect Children Philippines project, which aims to safeguard children of all ages and genders in the province.

General Mariano Alvarez is among the municipalities covered by the project, alongside the City of Trece Martires, Naic, Tanza, and Silang.

The 17, Waidergorn said, are composed mostly of mayors who came to Israel as part of MASHAV’s study tour on urban agriculture and green cities.

The delegation, along with four other groups of local government officials from Latin America, Asia, and Africa, was supposed to participate in the Israeli trade show Muni Expo 2025 that was slated for June 17 to 19.

“We were very happy and very excited that they came, but the situation has changed, and we are making sure to do everything — that they will be safe and that they will be able to leave Israel as soon as possible,” Waidergorn said.

The MASHAV executive said when not hunkered down the bomb shelters, the

group continues to participate in the study program.

“We make sure also that during the day and during their program, the programs continue and we try to give them lecture and make sure their time passes as best as possible under the circumstance,” she said.

Waidergorn said the Israeli side is in constant talks with Jordanian authorities and Israeli traveling companies to see if the group can leave early via land to Jordan.

“Our consular services are in touch with the Jordanian authorities making sure that everybody that has to go via Jordan will be able to go via Jordan and go home safely,” she said.

“For this group, from where they are, this is a shorter travel and a

better travel. So, that’s the route that was chosen. As we speak everything is being done for the safe travel as soon as possible, hopefully already this week,” she added.

Waidergorn said the Philippine government, through the Philippine Embassy in Tel Aviv, is also in “full coordination” with MASHAV and Israeli government.

A total of 22 Filipinos were visiting under Israeli sponsorship when Israel mounted its military campaign against Iran, prompting deadly retaliatory air strikes that began on the evening of June 13.

One of the 22 was visiting under an LGBTQ advocacy program and has already left Israel, according to Waidergorn. (PNA)

More e-vehicle charging points sought in Calabarzon

CALAMBA CITY (PIA)—Advocates of clean mobility have pushed for the installation of more electric vehicle (EV) charging stations in the Calabarzon region to encourage more Filipinos to go electric and promote environment-friendly vehicles on the road.

Engr. Ladislao Andal, chairperson of the Regional Development Council's Sectoral Committee on Infrastructure Development (SCID) said limited charging infrastructures poses a challenge in the seamless adoption of environment-friendly energy sources.

"There is a need to intensify the establishment of charging stations in the region," Andal emphasized.

The Department of Energy reported at least 912 publicly accessible charging stations nationwide as of March 31, 2025, which are primarily concentrated in the National Capital Region.

Andal said the EV charging infrastructure is aligned with the Philippine Energy Plan 2023-2050, the national blueprint for increasing the share



of renewable energy in the country's power generation mix to at least 35 percent by 2030.

"This strategy will increase the share of renewable energy by reducing the reliance on fossil fuels, enhance energy security, and decarbonize the transportation sector," Anda said.

Moreover, an environment-friendly transportation sector will also help reduce carbon emission and improve air quality in Calabarzon, which is home to numerous economic zones, manufacturing hubs from car and electronics, logistics warehouses and other multinational companies.

EV users reported that most charging stations in Calabarzon are located inside industrial parks and in parking areas of select hotels.

Richard Albert Osmond, RDC co-chair and private sector representative, said

golf and country clubs have also installed EV charging stations for club members and visitors.

"Most clubhouses in golf clubs have installed charging stations," Osmond noted.

Clean Air Asia, an international non-governmental organization that aims to promote better air quality and more livable cities through reduced air pollution and greenhouse gas emission, reported that a total of 9,666 EVs in the country have been registered with the Land Transportation Office (LTO) in 2022. Most of these vehicles are two-wheeler and three-wheelers that are generally used for personal or public transport.

However, the NGO admits a possible gap as registration of e-bikes, e-motorcycles, or e-tricycles has yet to be fully implemented in the country. (PB/PIA4A)

DA expands, refines P20/kg. rice program logistics framework

MANILA – The Department of Agriculture (DA) on Tuesday reported the continuous expansion of its PHP20 per kg. rice program under the "Benteng Bigas Meron (BBM) Na," alongside efforts to refine the logistics framework to better serve the beneficiaries.

This came after the DA included Siquijor province in its pilot implementation of BBM Na in the Visayas region, making the program accessible in 123 sites nationwide.

These include 88 Kadiwa ng Pangulo (KNP) Centers, kiosks, stalls in public markets, local government units, and other agencies; as well as 35 Department of Labor and Employment (DOLE) and private companies-accredited establishments in the

country.

"The launch of the P20 program in this magical island of Siquijor serves as a strategic model for the initial rollout of the program across other island provinces," DA Secretary Francisco Tiu Laurel Jr. said in a statement.

He said the move will help the DA "draw the

blueprint" of program expansion in the country.

At least 425 households or around 1,700 individuals are expected to benefit from the first phase of the BBM Na rollout in Siquijor.

Scientific working group says zero dengue deaths ‘achievable’

MANILA – The number of dengue cases worldwide has doubled to over 14 million in 2024 with Asia accounting for 70 percent of the global burden, a scientific working group said Monday.

Asia Dengue Voice and Action (ADVA) Group steering committee member Maria Rosario Capeding said the Philippines is one of the countries in the region with a growing number of dengue cases.

“Dengue is preventable and with scientific innovation, the right strategies and strong community partnerships, achieving zero dengue deaths is achievable. We want to protect lives, eliminate preventable deaths and put a stop to this global threat,” she said during a press conference at the 8th Asia Dengue Summit in Quezon City.

Capeding added that the Philippines can always learn from the successful campaigns of its neighbor countries.

Summit organizing committee co-chair Fatima Gimenez noted that the government alone cannot address the country’s dengue problem.

“Every sector has a part to play. The health workers, advocates, the public and media – we are all in this together. We can turn the tide on dengue,” she said.

She added that vaccination is one of the ways by which the disease could be controlled, with coordination between the public and private sector.

adviser and Philippine Foundation for Vaccination executive director Lulu Bravo emphasized that vaccination is the most cost-effective preventive measure for dengue and other diseases.

“We (Philippines) have had dengue for more than 70 years... It is so ironic that in the Eastern Asia where dengue has started long before, we are still lagging behind in terms to vaccination,” she said.

Bravo has been advocating for the approval of second-generation anti-dengue vaccines. She said the application with the Food and Drug Administration started two years ago, although their team has been doing clinical trials for eight years.

Meanwhile, ADVA international adviser Tikki Pang said vaccine eligibility differs in every nation.

“In a country like Philippines and Malaysia, in Malaysia where

I come from, everybody is at risk, and in terms of eligibility, it depends on which age group is particularly affected or vulnerable. In the Philippines it’s still the pediatric and young age group,” he said.

According to data from the Department of Health (DOH), a total of 119,774 dengue cases were recorded from Jan. 1 to May 31 this year.

The DOH said a downward trend for over 10 consecutive weeks was observed. From May 4 to 17, there were 5,900 cases reported, marking a 12-percent decrease from the 6,707 cases logged in the preceding period (April 20 to May 3).

However, the agency said the number of cases is expected to rise with the rainy season.

Dengue viruses are spread to people through the bites of the infected Aedes species mosquitoes. Symptoms



United Against Dengue: Cavite’s Collective Stand for Prevention

On June 10, 2025, the Auditorium of the Cavite Collaboration Center for Public Health (CCCCPH), TMC Cavite, became the battleground for ideas, action, and advocacy as health professionals marked Dengue Awareness Month with the theme: “United Against Dengue: Prevention Starts with Us.”

The event opened with a comprehensive and inspiring welcome message from Dr. Nelson C. Soriano, Provincial Health Officer I, who set the stage with a strong call for continuous vigilance and community-based action. His message echoed what many already know: dengue prevention doesn’t start with fogging—it starts with awareness, involvement, and simple, consistent action.

Taking inspiration up a notch, Ms. Ludette Lontoc, Development Management Officer IV, delivered an empowering message that resonated well beyond the walls of the auditorium. She reminded everyone of the DOH’s 4T formula—“Taob, Taktak, Tuyo at Takip”—practical yet powerful steps in eliminating mosquito breeding sites. She also highlighted the WILD diseases to watch out for: W – Waterborne diseases; I – Influenza-like illness; L – Leptospirosis and D – Dengue.

Recognizing local health champions, she closed with a striking reminder that blended advocacy with compassion: “Bawat aksyon, bawat solusyon, bawat paalala, ‘wag magsasawa. Dapat tandaan—bawat buhay ay mahalaga.”

The celebration was a convergence of medical professionals, health staff, and frontline advocates, all determined to push forward the province’s anti-dengue initiatives.

Mr. Rafael McDonald, Nurse II, acknowledged the participants, while Ms. Christine D. Perey, RN, Provincial Dengue Coordinator, presented the objectives of the celebration. She emphasized the key roles of local government units and community participation in curbing the dengue threat.

Bringing the data to light, Ms. Cristina A. Amulong, CAE, Sanitation Inspector III and PESU Coordinator, shared the latest Dengue Surveillance Report for Cavite—an eye-opener that reminded everyone that the numbers are not just statistics, but stories waiting to be prevented.

Ms. Barbie P. Calisaan, Health Education and Promotion Officer I, followed with a discussion on Dengue Awareness and Prevention, equipping participants with life-saving knowledge and timely strategies.

The event culminated in a Pledge of Commitment, recited and signed by participants and led by Dr. Soriano, symbolizing the province’s united stand against dengue. To close the program, Dr. Armand J. Dotollo, Head of the Communicable Disease Cluster, delivered the closing remarks and facilitated an open forum, allowing voices from the ground to be heard and responded to.

Group flags 'toxic' water tumblers sold amid school opening

MANILA — An environmental watchdog on Tuesday warned parents and students against the sale of insulated steel tumblers painted with high levels of lead, a toxic substance especially hazardous to children.

A day after the official opening of classes in public schools, volunteers from the EcoWaste Coalition disclosed they bought some of these tumblers sold on the streets of Binondo and Quiapo in Manila.

The tumblers were subjected to X-Ray Fluorescence (XRF) analysis, a scientific method used to quickly detect elemental composition.

Findings revealed that 11 unbranded tumblers had exterior coatings containing lead concentrations well above the legal limit of 90 parts per million (ppm).

A plain yellow-painted 600 milliliter (ml) tumbler registered 61,850 ppm of lead. Other tumblers in colors such as yellow (800 ml), orange, ap-

ple green, rust orange, army green, red, light green, and cream also tested positive for lead, with levels ranging from 47,270 ppm down to 1,532 ppm.

Meanwhile, two cartoon-themed tumblers -- a red one featuring a car character and a pink one with a Hello Kitty design -- contained 4,500 ppm and 1,087 ppm of lead, respectively.

The Department of Environment and Natural Resources, through its Chemical Control Order (CCO), has banned the use of lead in paints for decorative applications since 2016 and for industrial use since 2019.

The CCO also prohibits the use of lead-containing paints in school supplies, toys, and other specified products.

Despite the ban, the group expressed concern over the unregulated presence of lead-painted tumblers in the marketplace, warning of potential health hazards.

It emphasized that the paint on these tum-

blers can deteriorate, flake, and chip off with frequent use.

Consequently, this poses a serious risk of lead exposure -- especially among children -- when ingested.

Citing the Partnership for a Lead-Free Future, the group noted that children are particularly vulnerable to lead poisoning due to their developing bodies absorbing the metal at four to five times the rate of adults.

Lead exposure, even at low levels, has been linked to irreversible neurological damage, reduced IQ, behavioral issues, and cognitive delays.

The World Health Organization (WHO) also reiterates that "there is no level of exposure to lead that is known to be without harmful effects."

The group urged the national government to designate a specific agency responsible for regulating lead in consumer products like tumblers and ensuring their removal from store shelves. (PNA)
