Voters call for transparency, good governance from election winners

MANILA – As Filipinos trooped to polling centers under the blazing daytime heat, one message echoed across precincts in Manila -- voters are demanding for transparency, integrity, and genuine public service from those who will win this year's elections.

At the Rosauro Almarrio Elementary School

in Tondo, Manila, voters told the Philippine News Agency that this election is not just about shaded names on a ballot, but about selecting good leaders who would prioritize clean governance and true service to their constituents.

Patricia Policarpio, 28, made her call and hopes clear to those who will be declared

winners of this year's elections.

“Ang call ko sa kanila dapat maging transparent sila sa mga ginagastos kasi pera ng taong bayan Yun (My call to them is that they should be transparent about what they spend because it's the people's money),” she said.

For Policarpio, voting

was a responsibility not just to the nation but for the future of her child, and the next generations.

She said good governance begins with empathy.

“Ang mabuting lider dapat may malasakit, hindi lang para sa sarili. Dapat alam nila ang hirap ng mga tao sa araw-araw, mababang sahod, mahirap ang commute. Hindi dapat sila ang lang ang nakikinabang (A good leader should care not just for themselves.

recently broke ground, signaling the start of the project's construction.

Meralco rates down in May

MANILA – The Manila Electric Co. (Meralco) said Tuesday electricity rates in its franchise areas declined by PHP0.7499 per kilowatt hour (kWh) this May.

In a statement Tuesday, Meralco said the reduction brings the overall rate for

a typical household to PHP12.2628 from PHP13.0127 per kWh in April.

“For residential customers consuming 200 kWh, they will see a decrease of around PHP150 in their total electricity bill this month. The rate reduction is due to

lower generation and transmission charges,” Meralco Vice President and Head of Corporate Communications Joe Zalzarriaga said.

According to Meralco, the lower rates for this month were due to the decline in genera-

They should know the hardships people face every day, low wages, difficult commutes. They shouldn't be the only ones who benefit),” she added.

Rose Ann Dongines, 32, meanwhile, called on those who are elected to prove their worth through service.

She said that for her, qualifications alone are not enough, because what matters is the ability to sincerely serve the people.

“Hindi puro salita kundi nasa gawa dapat. Ayusin nila ang

SSS, DICT partner to boost services in remote areas via e-Wheels

LUCENA CITY, Quezon (PIA) — More enhanced Social Security System (SSS) services now await grassroots communities as the SSS and the Department of Information and Communications Technology (DICT) team up for the SSS e-Wheels program.

Through this partnership, the DICT has equipped the SSS e-Wheels with free high-speed internet, enabling the delivery of SSS services to far-flung areas.

SSS Lucena Branch Head Frederick D. Isip explained that the partnership will strengthen the SSS e-Wheels program by ensuring seamless online services in areas with limited or no internet

tion charges, transmission charges, and other charges.

The generation charge went down by PHP0.3144 per kWh to PHP7.4651 per kWh, primarily due to lower charges from the Wholesale Electricity Spot Market (WESM) and Independent Power Producers (IPPs).

Meralco said WESM charges fell by PHP1.1424 per kWh as a result of the improved supply situation in the Luzon Grid, while IPP charges also went down by PHP0.9555 per kWh due to higher average IPP dispatch and the peso appreciation.

The transmission charge for residential customers was also reduced by PHP0.2970 per kWh.

"Ancillary Service charges from the Reserve Market and the National Grid Corp. of the Philippines' (NGCP) Ancillary Service Procurement Agreements (ASPAs) both registered reductions in the April supply month," Meralco said.

the My.SSS portal and SSS Mobile App, real-time processing of contributions (RTPC), membership applications, online registration, verification, and benefit consultations in last-mile communities.

"This initiative reflects our commitment to innovation and excellent public service, ensuring that no member is left behind due to connectivity challenges. We can now efficiently bring essential transactions closer to the people, making our services more accessible and reliable.

"In addition, the transmission charge this May no longer includes Energy Regulatory Commission (ERC)-approved adjustments related to NGCP's Reserve Market transactions for February and March 2024, following the completion of collection last month."

Other charges, including taxes, similarly registered a net decrease of PHP0.1385 per kWh.

Meralco, meanwhile, said that electricity service in the more than 3,000 polling and canvassing centers and other election sites during the May 12 elections was generally stable.

It said there were no major service disruptions reported.

"Overall, the isolated and minor electricity service concerns were immediately resolved by our crews and did not cause any major delay in the voting process within our franchise area," Zal-darriaga said.

DOH strengthens HIV public health campaign in CAR

BAGUIO CITY (PIA) — The Department of Health in the Cordillera region is strengthening the promotion of a public health campaign that aims to reduce human immunodeficiency virus (HIV) stigma, encourage testing and treatment, and empower people living with HIV (PLHIV).

The DOH's Undetectable equals Untransmittable (U=U) campaign goal is for all PLHIV to regularly take their medication for them to achieve an undetectable HIV viral load, a level wherein a PLHIV can no longer transmit nor infect others with the HIV virus, said Darwin Babon, development management officer at the DOH.

In CAR, 31 percent of the total cases are considered Acute HIV disease. In terms of treatment, CAR has an average treatment retention rate of 80.57 percent in all the treatment hubs in the region in 2024, Babon shared.

Viral suppression in the region is at 99.5 percent and 90.67 percent of which have been recorded as undetectable.

“End goal natin is zero AIDS – related death in the region through increased demand generation for HIV testing to ensure early diagnosis. Iniiwasan natin dito ay late diagnosis, yung mga may complications na like TB, pneumonia and also cancer,” Babon said.

He is encouraging individuals, especially

those at the younger age bracket and involved in high risk behaviors and having multiple partners, to have an HIV screening, which is given free at HIV treatment hubs and by other DOH partners.

The HIV/AIDS Treatment Hubs in the region are located at the Baguio City Health Services Office, Baguio General Hospital and Medical Center, Benguet Provincial Hospital, Kalinga Provincial Hospital, Luis Horal Memorial Regional Hospital in Bauko, Mountain Province, and Far North Luzon General Hospital and Training Center in Luna, Apayao.

Based on DOH-CAR records, there are 1,290 cases of HIV recorded in the region from 1984 to present, including 81 new cases in 2024 and 31 in the first two months of this year.

Most of the cases are males with 1,198 and more than half of the cases (731) were tagged in Baguio City.

On mode of transmis-

sion, the top three are men having sex with men or MSMs (779), male – female sex (293) and males having sex with females and male (285), Babon shared.

Babon moreover promoted International AIDS Candlelight Memorial, an annual event that is being observed every third Sunday of May dedicated in memory of those who have died from AIDS. Likewise, to express support to people living with HIV.

The theme of the 2025 International AIDS Candlelight Memorial is “We remember, we rise, we lead”.

This honors the collective memory of our journeys together, celebrate the resilience that brings us forward and embraces the responsibility of leadership in shaping healthier and stronger communities for our PLHIV, Babon shared.

Overall, 758,549 poll workers were deployed nationwide.

The DepEd Task Force, meanwhile, logged 603 election-related issues through its 24/7 command center.

The reports included malfunctioning automated counting machines, irregularities in ballots and receipts, and voters' list concerns, with the majority of reports coming from Metro Manila and the Bangsamoro Autonomous Region in Muslim Mindanao.

The DepEd earlier said prompt responses were given in coordination with the Commission on Elections and other government agencies. (PNA)

Shell Pilipinas sees stronger performance for 2025

MANILA – Officials of Shell Pilipinas Corporation (SPC) on Tuesday expressed optimism for the continued growth of their business amidst the challenging economy both here and abroad.

In a disclosure, the listed firm said net income in the first quarter this year reached PHP740 million, lower than its PHP1.4 billion level a year ago, attributed to increased competition and market volatility. Core earnings, meanwhile, rose by 26 percent to PHP870 million.

For the whole year, SPC president and chief executive officer Lorelie Osial, in an online briefing, said the focus will be on cash,

returns, and growth.

“After reporting a cash flow deficit in the last six years, we have made the most and is progressing in 2024 and we will continue that momentum in 2025 vis-à-vis by volume growth, sustained cost reductions, and step changes when it comes to working capital improvements,” she said.

In 2024, the company posted a PHP1.3 billion net income, up from the previous year’s PHP1.2 billion net income. Core income reached PHP2.6 billion from PHP2.3 billion in 2023.

SPC Executive Director Reynaldo Abilo, during the same briefing, said their 2024

core earnings rose by 15 percent and net income by 6 percent.

“That reflects the kind of financial discipline and operational agility that (we have) as a company. We will sustain these gains and transition these into long-term growth,” he said.

He said priority for the next five to six years includes strengthening market positions, deleveraging on balance sheet, and generating healthy cash flow.

The company has set an annual capital

spending of between PHP2 billion to PHP3 billion for this year and next year, which will be internally sourced.

Michael Ramolete, another Executive Director, said they focus to build, upgrade, and refresh mobility positions and invest more in their biggest import terminal, the Tabangao refinery in Batangas City.

He said they also plan to open 15 to 20 new branches to boost their sales. (PNA)

Trump to sign order slashing US drug prices by up to 80%

ISTANBUL— US President Donald Trump announced late Sunday that he will sign a sweeping executive order aimed at dramatically reducing prescription drug prices in the US by as much as 80 percent, declaring it one of the “most consequential Executive Orders in our country’s history.”

“For many years the World has wondered why Prescription Drugs and Pharmaceuticals in the United States of America were SO MUCH HIGHER IN PRICE THAN THEY WERE IN ANY OTHER NATION,” Trump wrote in a lengthy post on his Truth Social platform.

“It was always difficult to explain...The Pharmaceutical/Drug Companies would say, for years, that it was Research and Development Costs, and that all of these costs were, and would be, for no reason whatsoever, borne by the ‘suckers’ of America, ALONE,” he said.

He said the executive order, scheduled for signing Monday morning at 9 a.m. (local time) in the White House, will introduce a “Most Favored Nation’s Policy” — a pricing model that ensures the US pays no more than the lowest price charged for the same drug in any other developed country.

“Prescription Drug and Pharmaceutical prices will be REDUCED, almost immediately, by 30 percent to 80 percent,” he added.

“They will rise throughout the World

in order to equalize and, for the first time in many years, bring FAIRNESS TO AMERICA!”

Move could save Americans billions

The policy echoes a previous effort from Trump’s first term, when his administration attempted to link Medicare Part B drug payments to prices in other nations.

That plan was blocked in court following a lawsuit from the pharmaceutical industry.

Trump’s revived strategy, previewed last week by NBC News and first reported by Politico, would again target pricing disparities between the US and countries such as Germany, the UK and Canada.

Health policy experts say the move could save Americans billions, though they caution about industry resistance.

“If this can do something about what is clearly an emergency...I’m for it,” said Arthur Caplan, head of the medical ethics division at NYU Langone Medical Center, according to NBC News.

“I don’t see an excuse for why prices should be all over the place, and we wind up getting charged the most,” Caplan said.

News added that Stacie Dusetzina, a professor at Vanderbilt University, also expressed skepticism about the policy’s durability: “I am unsure the new executive order will fare any better” than the 2020 version.

Still, polling suggests public support. A Kai-

ser Family Foundation (KFF) survey found that over three-quarters of US adults consider drug prices unaffordable.

NBC News reported that Tricia Neuman, executive director of KFF’s Medicare policy program, said: “The idea of making sure the US pays no more than similar countries polls well but...will likely face fierce opposition from the pharmaceutical industry.”

Trump emphasized that his plan is aimed not only at fairness but at national savings.

“Our citizens’ Healthcare Costs will be reduced by numbers never even thought of before,” he said. “Additionally, on top of everything else, the United States will save TRILLIONS OF DOLLARS.” (Anadolu)

2025 midterm polls ‘very peaceful’ – PNP chief

MANILA – Except for minor glitches in counting machines and shooting incidents, the 2025 midterm elections are generally peaceful and orderly, Philippine National Police (PNP) Gen. Rommel Francisco Marbil said on Monday.

“It’s very peaceful. But all our policemen on the grounds remain on guard, they continue to make arrests. My instruction is to arrest all those who would dare to create trouble,” Marbil said in a media briefing.

He said the 163,000 policemen, backed by over 200,000 per-

MANILA – A total of 970 overseas Filipino workers (OFWs) in Jeddah and Riyadh, Saudi Arabia have qualified and registered for the free competency assessment of the Technical Education and Skills Development Authority (TESDA) next month.

TESDA will conduct the assessment from June 4 to 7 in Jeddah and from June 10 to 25 in Riyadh.

“By certifying their skills, we help open doors to better job opportunities, professional growth, and reintegration options back home. Many of them have acquired valuable skills over the years, and it’s only right that they receive formal recognition that they can carry anywhere in the world,” TESDA Secretary Francisco Beni-

sonnel from other law enforcement agencies, will continue to be on watch until the canvassing of votes is completed.

“We don’t see any problem right now, but we will be monitoring the accounting after the election by 7 p.m. But I said we need more forces by 6 p.m. We want full force by 6 p.m. up to 12 o’clock for the counting (of votes),” he said.

PNP spokesperson Brig. Gen. Jean Fajardo said technical glitches and power interruptions were reported in some parts of Central Luzon, Northern Mindanao, Davao,

The free assessment is for qualifications, such as Caregiving NC II, Caregiving (Elderly) NC II, Health Care Services NC II, Massage Therapy NC II, Electrical Installation and Maintenance NC II, Photovoltaic Systems Installation NC II, and Barista NC II.

Since 2014, about 7,784 OFWs were provided with assessment, TESDA said Tuesday.

Meanwhile, TESDA

said applicants must submit the required documents, including a duly accomplished application form, a self-assessment guide corresponding to the qualification being applied for, and a copy of a training certificate or certificate of employment to the nearest Migrant Workers office.

and the Cordillera Administrative Region have been resolved.

Marbil said the PNP’s intensified operations do not end after the voting process, saying another crucial part of the polls is the canvassing of votes.

Meanwhile, oil companies will slash fuel prices starting May 13.

Seoil and Shell said they would decrease gasoline prices by 30 centavos per liter, 90 centavos per liter on diesel prices, and PHP1.25 per liter on kerosene prices.

Other oil firms are expected to follow suit.

This is the second consecutive week that local industry players have implemented an

oil price rollback.

Earlier, the Department of Energy's (DOE) Oil Industry Management Bureau attributed the lower oil prices this week to the decision of the OPEC+ to ramp up output next month, improving global supply, while the uncertainties due to the United States' tariff policy continue to dampen demand.

"Year-to-date, gasoline has a total net increase of PHP3.10

per liter as well as diesel with a total net increase of PHP3 per liter. Kerosene has a total net decrease of PHP2 per liter," DOE said.

With the oil price adjustment last week, gasoline prices in Metro Manila range from PHP44 to PHP73.21 per liter, from PHP44 to PHP73.94 per liter for diesel, and from PHP67.10 to PHP83.89 per liter for kerosene. (PNA)
