## DA to lower MSRP for 5% broken imported rice to P43/kg.

MANILA – To further reduce rice retail prices and benefit Filipino consumers in line with the directives of President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr., the Department of Agriculture (DA) said Thursday it is eyeing to reduce the maximum suggested retail price (MSRP) for 5 percent broken imported rice on July 1.

The rice MSRP was last adjusted on March

31, after a series of “gradual” reductions that began from PHP58 per kg. in January.

In a Viber message, DA Secretary Francisco Tiu Laurel said they would reduce the MSRP to PHP43 per kg. of 5 percent broken rice from the current PHP45 per kg.

He said the attempt could further drag down the retail prices of rice in local markets

and decrease the prevailing prices of other rice varieties.

“(The target is) lower PHP40s for 5 percent broken, mid-PHP30s for 25 percent broken, and lower PHP30s for 100 percent broken,” he said in an interview.

Tiu Laurel disclosed their plan even as rice inflation was logged at -12.8 percent in May, slower than -10.9 percent in April, according to the latest data

from the Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA).

As of June 4, the prevailing prices of imported premium and well-milled rice in Metro Manila are PHP45 per kg., and PHP40.5 per kg. for imported regular-milled rice.

The price per kg. of premium imported rice, meanwhile, ranges from PHP43 to PHP50; imported

### Frequent handwashing key to preventing mpox spread

CALAMBA CITY (PIA) – Health authorities are reminding the public to observe frequent handwashing using soap and water or alcohol-based hand sanitizer to prevent the spread of the monkeypox virus, more commonly known as mpox.

In a statement, the Department of Health (DOH) Calabarzon warned that mpox is a contagious disease

well-milled rice from PHP38 to PHP48; and imported regular milled rice from PHP35 to PHP45.

The prices per kg. of premium local rice ranges from PHP44 to PHP60; local well-milled rice, PHP38 to PHP52; and local regular-milled rice, PHP30 to PHP45; with prevailing prices set at PHP50, PHP45, and PHP40, respectively.

The DA earlier attributed the persistent downward trend of rice prices to various government interventions, including the setting of MSRP on imported rice, the launch of the PHP20-per-kg. rice under the “Benteng

Bigas Meron (BBM Na,” the availability of Rice-for-All (RFA) varieties, and the declaration of a food security emergency for rice.

The price per kg. of the DA’s RFA5 or 5 percent broken was earlier set at PHP43; PHP35 for RFA25 or 25 percent broken; and PHP33 for RFA100 or 100 percent broken.

Tiu Laurel, meanwhile, assured that the rice MSRP reduction would not take its toll on the buying price of local harvest amid the tail-end of the harvest season. (PNA)

that can be passed on through bodily fluid and exposure to respiratory droplets from infected patients.

“The mpox can be passed on through close skin-to-skin contact, sexual intercourse, talking, or exposure to respiratory droplets and contaminated objects that were previously touched by infected patients.”

The DOH advised the public to follow public health protocols, such as refraining from contact with individuals infected with mpox or those manifesting symptoms, and frequent sanitation of commonly used and shared objects.

Health authorities are also advising the

public to be critical of information on the disease and to rely on well-vetted information and announcements from DOH to prevent falling victim to fake news and disinformation.

According to DOH, mpox is an infectious disease that can cause a painful rash, enlarged lymph nodes, fever, headache, muscle ache, back pain, and low energy.

Its global outbreak began in 2022, and it can be transmitted through close contact, using contaminated objects such as clothing or linen, through needle injuries in health care, or in community settings such as tattoo parlors. (PB, PIA4A)

**Medical and Dental Mission Reaches Brgy. Fatima II**

A successful medical and dental mission was conducted in Barangay Fatima II, City of Dasmariñas on May 23, 2025 benefitting a total of 229 residents with free healthcare services during the one-day outreach activity.

A series of insightful talks from distinguished speakers followed. Ms. Adahlia Babiera discussed the provisions on Tonsorial and Beauty Establishments under PD 856, emphasizing sanitary and hygiene protocols. Dr. Armand Dotollo presented on other blood-borne diseases that could pose challenges to tattoo artists. Mr. Symson Maquera gave an informative lecture on HIV 101, outlining key aspects of the virus.

These discussions were impactful, as they provided participants with foundational knowledge and practical insights.

After the orientation, a Tattoo Expo was held featuring selected members of Mananato ng Luzon.



**Medical and Dental Mission Held in Tropical Village, Brgy. San Francisco**

A total of 335 residents of Tropical Village, Brgy. San Francisco, City of Gen. Trias benefited from a medical and dental mission held last May 29, 2025.

The activity was conducted by the Provincial Government of Cavite (PGC) through the Office of the Provincial Governor and Office of the Provincial Health Officer. Medical and dental professionals from General Emilio Aguinaldo Memorial Hospital (GEAMH) provided free services such as medical consultations, dental check-ups, and tooth extractions. ## Task force checks compliance with salt iodization law

BAUAN, Batangas (PIA) — The Regional Bantay Asin Task Force (RBATF) in Calabarzon has intensified its enforcement and information campaign to boost public nutrition and combat iodine deficiency disorders (IDD), strengthening on-site monitoring of salt production facilities in Batangas.

The monitoring activity, led by the National Nutrition Council (NNC) IV-A and the Batangas Provincial Health Office (PHO), aimed to verify whether the salt being produced and distributed in the region meets the required iodine content as mandated by Republic Act 8172, or the “ASIN Law.”

Kyla Guardia, NNC IV-A’s project development officer, said iodine is a crucial micronutrient that plays a vital role in brain development, especially in children and pregnant women.

“Lack of iodine in the diet can lead to goiter, learning disabilities, and other long-term health issues. Our site visits to salt production facilities help ensure that the salt produced meets the 30–70 parts per million requirement mandated by the ASIN Law,” she explained.

During the site visits to Salinas Foods Inc. and Artemis Salt Corporation in Bauan, Batangas, the task force collected salt samples from various stages of production and assessed the iodization process used by the facilities through the WYD iodine checker.

Equipment, storage conditions, and the mixing of iodine



compounds were also closely inspected to ensure compliance with Food and Drug Administration (FDA) standards.

Batangas Provincial Nutrition Officer Grace Mauhat said the initiative is also part of their continued commitment to public health and nutrition, emphasizing that by ensuring compliance with iodization standards, salt producers are helping protect future generations from preventable health conditions.

NNC data shows that the Median Urinary Iodine Concentration (UIC) for children aged 6–12 years in the Calabarzon Region is 174 µg/L, which indicates adequate iodine nutrition based on the World Health Organization’s standard of 100–199 µg/L.

Plant operators expressed support for the government’s efforts, noting improvements

in both product quality and compliance with broader regulations.

“Apart from ensuring proper iodization, we also make sure our operations follow environmental and labor standards. We aim to provide not just safe and nutritious salt, but also a safe working environment for our employees and sustainable practices that protect our community,” said Susan Lee, Marketing and Sales Manager of Artemis Salt Corporation.

The inspection also served as an opportunity to engage salt producers in discussions on improving practices, upgrading equipment, and sustaining quality control systems.

The RBATF emphasized that beyond enforcement, education and collaboration with local stakeholders are key to achieving the goals of the ASIN Law. (CCM, PIA4A)

## Legarda backs DOH call for national emergency on HIV surge

MANILA – Senator Loren Legarda on Wednesday backs the Department of Health’s (DOH) call to declare a national public health emergency the surge in human immunodeficiency virus (HIV) cases.

This, after the health department reported a 500 percent surge in cases among Filipinos aged 15 to 25 in the first quarter this year.

Latest HIV/AIDS Surveillance Report showed there are 148,831 HIV cases recorded nationwide from 1984 to March this year.

A total of 5,101 cases were logged during the first quarter of this year, higher than the 3,409 recorded during

the same period last year.

Meanwhile, an average of 57 HIV cases were reported daily, also higher than the 37 recorded during the same period last year.

These include the case of a 12-year-old girl from Palawan, the youngest confirmed case in the region who got infected through sexual transmission.

“This reflects a deepening public health and social crisis. The case of the young girl in Palawan underscores the vulnerability of our children and adolescents, and the urgent need for targeted, compassionate interventions,” Legarda said in a news release.

“We must expand

access to free and confidential testing, strengthen awareness and education, and build a more responsive health system that can sustain prevention, treatment, and care,” she said.

Senator Sherwin Gatchalian called the reported 500 percent increase in HIV infections among young Filipinos a public health emergency that

demands urgent government response.

“This is a wake-up call that our youth are in danger,” he said.

Gatchalian urged the Department of Education to address inconsistencies in its 2018 policy on reproductive health education and ensure its proper implementation, and emphasized the need to engage parents and strengthen values formation through existing education programs. (PNA)

## DOLE to hold nationwide job fair on June 12

MANILA – The Department of Labor and Employment (DOLE) is set to hold another nationwide job fair on June 12, the 127th anniversary of Philippine independence.

“Our Independence Day gift to our workers is a massive nationwide job fair,” DOLE Secretary Bienvenido Laguesma said in a radio interview on Wednesday.

“We are already finalizing the arrangements, including the venues and sites of the job fairs.”

DOLE last held a nationwide job fair on

May 1, Labor Day. Data from the Bureau of Local Employment showed 5,780 applicants were hired on the spot (HOTS) in the 71 job fair sites that were set across the country.

The bureau said the number translates to a HOTS placement rate of 15.07 percent, exceeding last year’s 11.10 percent.

Meanwhile, for wage increase, particularly in the National Capital Region, Laguesma said an order may be issued in July “because that is the anniversary date of the last wage order.” (PNA)

## DOH-NCR intensifies anti-dengue drive in schools, communities

MANILA – The Department of Health-Metro Manila Center for Health Development (DOH-MMCHD) has strengthened its efforts to combat dengue infections in schools and communities in observance of the Dengue Awareness Month this June.

“Dengue prevention is a shared responsibility, and every member of the community has a role to play by maintaining cleanliness, participating in LGU (local government unit)-led clean-up activities, and ensuring timely medical consultation if anyone experiences dengue symptoms,” Regional Director Lester Tan said during a ceremonial activity at the Esteban Abada Elementary School in Quezon City on Thursday.

He said the four key actions — “Taob, Tak-tak, Tuyo, at Takip” (overturned, shake, dry, and cover)— serve as a simple and proven effective way to reduce mosquito-breed- ing sites and minimize the risk of dengue and other mosquito-borne disease transmission.

Latest report from the Regional Epidemiology and Surveillance Unit showed that a total of 19,083 dengue cases have been reported in the National Capital Region (NCR) from Jan. 1 to May 17.

The tally reflects a 224-percent increase compared to the 5,889 cases logged for the same period last year.

The majority of the cases were school-aged children. The dengue-related deaths account for a 0.27-percent case fatality rate.

Dengue is a virus transmitted to humans through infected Aedes mosquitoes.

In preparation for the opening of classes and the rainy season, the activity at the Esteban Abada Elementary School included the ceremonial installation of Insecticide Treated Screen (ITS) and Ovitrap in selected classrooms that aims to minimize the breeding and presence of dengue-carrying mosquitoes.

The ITS are designed to repel and kill mosquitoes on contact, while Ovitrap attract and trap mosquito eggs, reducing mosquito populations in and around school premises.

Targeted indoor and outdoor residual spraying was also done to show the strategic application of insecticides in areas prone to mosquito breeding.

The DOH collaborated with the Department of Education, Department of the Interior and Local Government, and the local government of Quezon City for the activity. (PNA)

## OECD projects steady economic growth for PH

MANILA – The Philippines is expected to continue to post stable growth this year and in 2026 mainly driven by consumer spending, the Organization for Economic Cooperation and Development (OECD) said.

OECD head of Indonesia and Philippines desk Cyrille Schwellnus said OECD projects the Philippine economic growth to hit 5.6 percent this year and accelerate to 6 percent in 2026.

“So in the Philippines, we see the growth momentum to be broadly stable. Okay, so consumer spending as in Indonesia, as in the Southeast Asian countries also drives economic growth here. So it’s the main driver of growth,” Schwellnus said in a virtual briefing Wednesday.

Swellnus said the continued growth in consumer spending is supported by a robust labor market as unemployment continues to settle at below 4 percent over the past months.

He said government spending also grew especially in the first quarter of this year, boosted by the mid-term elections.

While exports managed to grow for the past months, Schwellnus said OECD projects growth to weaken due to escalating global trade tensions.

“Even so, we see, that the Philippines is less

exposed to a slowing of global trade than many other Southeast Asian economies because its growth is mainly driven by domestic demand,” he said.

The OECD, meanwhile, is expecting headline inflation to continue to settle within the government’s target this year, allowing the BSP to further ease policy rates.

It projects inflation to remain contained at 2 percent in 2025 and 3.1 percent in 2026 amid balanced domestic demand and currency stability.

Swellnus, however, cited the need to continue to implement policy reforms to boost productivity and overall growth.

“So here, we have identified two critical areas. One is barriers to entry and competition, especially in electricity and telecommunications.

Electricity prices are very high in the Philippines, so strengthening competition would likely help to bring down prices,” he said.

Swellnus said lower electricity rates would help reduce costs for businesses and consumers, while encouraging private sector investment.

“A second priority we see is non-wage labor costs. So these should be brought down and that could be done, for instance, by shifting some of the social contributions that are currently financing health insurance to general taxation,” he said.

“We also see some room for employment regulations to be updated to make it easier for businesses to create formal jobs. All this would expand opportunities for workers while strengthening the foundations of economic growth,” he added. (PNA)
