## 89K local, overseas jobs available in Independence Day job fairs

MANILA — Over 89,000 local and overseas jobs will be up for grabs in different job fair sites nationwide on Thursday, Independence Day, the Department of Labor and Employment (DOLE) said Tuesday.

In a statement, DOLE said the 89,408 employment opportunities will be offered by 968 participating employers in 49 simultaneous job fairs across the country.

Job seekers are encouraged to explore local job opportunities primarily in positions

such as sales clerks/assistants, production operators, call center representatives, service crew, and loan officers offered by 896 participating employers.

DOLE said each job fair site will also host a one-stop-shop of government services to assist with pre-employment document processing and other auxiliary needs such as career development support, labor regulations consultations, and programs for livelihood, skills training, and entrepreneurship.

## Industry, infra key drivers to CALABARZON economy — DepDev

CALAMBA CITY (PIA) — Ongoing infrastructure programs and a growing industrial sector continue to drive economic growth in the CALABARZON region as it remains in its position as a top contributor to the national economy.

Ray Michael Abuso, Supervising Economic Development Specialist at the Department of Economy, Planning, and Development (DepDev) — formerly the National Econom-

ic and Development Authority (NEDA) — noted that ongoing infrastructure developments in the provinces of Laguna, Cavite, and Batangas have significantly bolstered the Regional Gross Domestic Product, valued at Php 3.10 trillion.

“All provinces in the region showed positive economic growth, reflecting growth-based economic momentum.”

Cavite Province recorded the highest



growth rate in the region with 6.7 percent. Meanwhile, the City of Lucena—the region’s only highly urbanized city—posted an even higher growth rate at 8.9 percent.

## Laguna town heightens anti-dengue drive amid rising cases

PAKIL, Laguna (PIA) — The local government of Pakil in Laguna has ramped up public health measures and awareness campaigns after the town was placed under a state of emergency due to rising dengue cases.

“The Pakil LGU, together with the Municipal Health Office and the Epidemiology and Surveillance Unit, is continuing its investigation and response. Community assemblies are being held in the barangays to raise awareness about

dengue,” said Danica Tolentino, head of the Laguna Provincial Epidemiology and Surveillance Unit (PESU), in an interview with the Philippine Information Agency Calabarzon.

ture, forestry, and fishing sector at Php 138 billion.

“Economic performance in the provinces is slightly influenced by manufacturing, infrastructure development, and sector diversification. With their industry-based economy, Laguna and Cavite, offer opportunities for residential and commercial development.”

Meanwhile, Batangas Province which hosts several power plants

supplying the region also shows increasing growth potential in the tourism sector.

“Overall, the CALABARZON region’s economic growth is shaped by infrastructure and industry focused in the urban expansion.”

To sustain economic growth, DepDev recommended long-term and province-specific solutions. These include expediting critical infrastructure proj-

ficiaries of the Special Program for Employment of Students.

To extend government assistance to vulnerable and underserved sectors, DOLE will likewise distribute over PHP190 million worth of wages to 33,323 beneficiaries of the Tulong Panghanapbuhay sa Ating Disadvantaged Workers (TUPAD) Program and over PHP73 million worth of livelihood assistance to 4,270 beneficiaries under the DOLE Integrated Livelihood Program (DILP) in 80 sites nationwide.

The initiatives are under the DOLE Integrated Livelihood and Emergency Employment Program, which aims to reduce the vulnerability of marginalized workers through temporary employment and entrepreneurship support.

In the National Capital Region, DOLE will participate in the Pampamahalaang Programa at Serbisyo caravan at Rizal Park, Manila from June 10 to 11 where among the services to be offered are the renewal of PRC licenses; application for productivity toolbox assistance; filing of labor concerns through the DOLE Assistance for Request Management System; filing of employees' compensation claims; registration with Phil-JobNet, the government's job-matching and labor market information portal; livelihood and emergency employment consultations; legal advice; and job fair pre-registration assistance.

passed a resolution on June 2 approving the declaration of state of emergency.

From January to June 2, 2025, Pakil recorded a total of 29 dengue cases, with five classified as active. Two children, aged 5 and 7, have died from dengue infection.

Tolentino added: "During the rainy season, there is a high risk of increased dengue cases. That is why we are monitoring not only confirmed cases but also suspected and probable ones to ensure the community is well-protected and closely observed."

In a statement, Mayor Vince Soriano said the declaration allows for the swift implementation of response measures and the mobilization of resources

to help curb the spread of the mosquito-borne disease.

The mayor also urged residents to take an active role in preventing the spread of dengue.

"We are constantly looking for areas where mosquitoes that carry dengue can breed. We urge everyone to help maintain cleanliness to prevent this type of disease," Soriano said.

The local government re-activated its "4S Kontra Dengue" campaign, an initiative that promotes searching and destroying mosquito breeding sites, securing self-protection measures like using mosquito repellents, seeking early consultation, and supporting fogging/spraying only in hotspot areas. ## Travelers urged to observe precautions vs. mpox

MANILA — With more travelers expected to fly for back-to-school season, AirAsia Philippines on Tuesday urged them to observe precautions against mpox.

The DOH made this call as it denied information circulating online claiming a lockdown is in place in the country due to mpox.

In an advisory, the department said it does not see the need to impose a lockdown as mpox is "not airborne."

The DOH said last week that all cases of mpox in the country belong to Clade 2 and not the fatal Clade 1B strain that caused the 2024 outbreak in the Democratic Republic of Congo.

Meanwhile, AirAsia said 20 percent of its market in 2024 is young individuals aged 2 to 24.

## Biyaheng South Summer Tour 2025: A Three-Day Road Trip into the Heart of the South

Metro Pacific Tollways South (MPT South) concessionaire of the Cavite-Laguna Expressway (CAL-AX) and Manila-Cavite Expressway (CAVITEX) marks another milestone with its flagship tourism advocacy campaign – Biyaheng South with its Summer Tour campaign.

### Breakfast and Scenic Drives in General Trias

The adventure kicked off with a scenic drive along the Cavite-Laguna Expressway (CALAX), where participants experienced firsthand the comfort of a smoother, faster, and more efficient travel to the South.

Traveling aboard the

FOTON Traveller and FOTON Traveller XL, the Ka-Biyaheros were able to relax and enjoy the journey in spacious, air-conditioned shuttles designed for group comfort. The highlight of the ride is the exclusive preview of the soon-to-open Governor's Drive Interchange, a key access point set to launch this 2025, which will extend CALAX's operating segment to Governor's Drive in General Trias, Cavite. This upcoming interchange is expected to decongest traffic on major roads in Cavite and significantly reduce travel time to key destinations like Carmona, General Trias, and Silang.

The participants then headed to Kura Cafe in General Trias, Cavite, which is just a short drive from CALAX Silang-Aguinaldo exit. The group was welcomed with specialty brews and morning pastries while basking in the charm of this local favorite. One of the cafe's best sellers is their pizza, specifically the Nutella with pistachios—a delightful fusion of sweet and savory. Other must-try dishes in their menu are beef quesadilla, oyster sisig, baked scallops, and banana bread.

Ride the Waves and Explore the Coast in Batangas

Their next activity was a relaxing cruise on the legendary Taal Lake in Talisay, Batangas. Surrounded by the famous volcano's silhouette and the still waters of the lake, the experience was both tranquil and visually stunning. A lakeside

lunch followed—featuring Batangueño favorites like crispy tawilis and lomi.

By mid-afternoon, participants arrived at Calatagan South Beach (CaSoBe), a premier beachside destination by Landco in Calatagan, Batangas, easily accessible via CALAX by taking the Silang-Aguinaldo exit and driving through Tagaytay-Nasugbu Road. The tour wrapped up at DEAFinitely Happy Store, a social enterprise supporting the deaf community. Here, travelers interacted with staff, picked up handmade pasalubong, and left not only with souvenirs but with a deeper appreciation for inclusivity and local advocacy.

## DOE, JICA partner for technical cooperation project on clean energy

MANILA – The Department of Energy (DOE) and the Japan International Cooperation (JICA) partnered to advance the Philippines' clean energy goals through a three-year technical cooperation project

In a statement on Tuesday, the DOE said outgoing Secretary Raphael Lotilla and JICA chief representative Baba Takashi signed the Records of Discussion for the Project on Resource Inventory of Hydropower Potential Sites on June 9.

Under the project, there will be a nationwide resource inventory of hydropower potential sites in the country.

The initiative aims to identify and assess viable large-scale hydropower sites across the country, in support of sustainable power generation and encourage greater private sector participation through the DOE's Open and Competitive Selection Process.

Scheduled to commence in September 2025, the project will focus on developing a national inventory

of large-scale hydropower sites, particularly those suitable for impounding and pumped-storage technologies with capacities exceeding 100 megawatts (MW).

The project will be implemented in three phases, beginning with the gathering of relevant data such as topographic maps, rainfall and flow data and conduct of field survey of four priority sites.

These pilot areas will be for pre-feasibility studies and potential future investment opportunities.

"This project marks a crucial step toward harnessing the full potential of hydropower, particularly pumped storage, as a strategic enabler of a power system that is clean, flexible, and resilient. Japan's global leadership in hydropower innovation brings immense value to this collaboration," Lotilla said.

"Through JICA's technical expertise, we gain the tools and insights needed to identify and unlock untapped hydropow-

er resources, laying a strong foundation for long-term investments, rural development, and enhanced energy security," Lotilla added.

## PH hopeful in Billie Jean King Cup campaign

MANILA — The Philippines has to hurdle Malaysia, Indonesia and Uzbekistan in a bid for promotional ranking in the Billie Jean King (BJK) Cup next week.

Shaira Hope Rivera and Alexa Joy Milliam from the University of Western Alabama, and Philippine Tennis Academy members Tennielle Madis and Stefi Marithe Aludo make up the national team that will see action in the BJK Cup Asia/Oceania Group 2 scheduled from June 16 to 21 at the National Tennis Centre in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia.

“Uzbekistan, Malaysia, and Indonesia are going to be the strongest teams,” said Dy during the Philippine Sportswriters Association (PSA) Forum on Tuesday at the Philippine Sports Commission (PSC) conference hall inside the Rizal Memorial Sports Complex on Tuesday.

Also in Group 2 are Northern Marian Islands, Iran, Pacific Oceania, Kyrgyzstan, Singapore, and Mongolia.

The team will leave on Saturday, while the tournament draw is on Sunday.

Rivera, who was part of the team that played

“I’m very excited to play again (for the Philippines). We have a good chance to win because (we) already know the players from other countries,” said the 25-year-old Rivera, an interdisciplinary management student.

The Filipinas are drawing inspiration from world's No. 77 Alexandra Eala, a graduate of the Rafael Nadal Academy in Mallorca, Spain.

The 20-year-old, playing as a wild card, beat former French Open champion Jelena Ostapenko

in the second round, 7-6-7-5; No. 5 and reigning Australian Open champion Madison Keys in the third round, 6-4, 6-2, and No. 2 and five-time Grand Slam champion Iga Swiatek in the quarterfinals, 6-2, 7-5 to reach the semifinal of the WTA1000 Miami Open in Florida in the United States last March.

Despite her 6-7 (3), 7-5, 3-6 loss to fourth seed American Jessica Pegula in the semifinal round, Eala became the first Filipina in the Open era to beat a player in the WTA Top 5. She is also the first Filipina to break into the Top 100, reaching a career-high No. 75 world ranking.
